- 1. North on County Road 8 (CR-8), go 4.2 miles
- 2. Turn LEFT onto CR-39, go 3.4 miles
- 3. Turn RIGHT onto Ireland Ave NW, go 1.7 miles
- 4. Turn RIGHT onto 112th St. NW, go 0.2 miles, road now becomes Illsely Ave. NW, go additional 0.1 miles
- 5. Turn RIGHT onto 113th St. NW, go 0.1 miles
- 6. Turn LEFT onto Hoyer Ave. NW, go 0.1 miles.



Pat and I got back from almost a month of touring China and visiting our son, who is working there. It is amazing how quickly they have modernized over the past 15 years when I was last there. I can recommend the trip to anyone who is interested in Asian history and culture.

We visited about seven cities, giving us a real contrast between old China and new China. We were welcomed everywhere we went and, though we were a curiosity to some, all wanted to learn more about the United States. The USA has become one of the top tourist destinations for the Chinese. Some of our top attractions were the Great Wall, The Forbidden City, and the Three Gorges Dam on the Yangtze River. We especially liked the Terra Cotta Warriors museum and archeological dig in the city of Xian. The food was outstanding and the hotels were all top notch with large rooms and baths. We also spent about five days with our son and daughter-in-law. We met them in Hong Kong for a couple of days of touring and then traveled back to their home in Senzhen, China for about three days. Senzhen is considered a small city with only 11,000,000 people! It is clean and modern with nice parks and recreation areas. It is a principle export city for Chinese manufactured goods.

MINUTES OF MEEETING, June 13, 2012

Secretary: Wayne Flury Members and guests of EAA Chapter 878 met on June 13 at the well-equipped workshop of Fred Jude. In the absence of our president and vice-president, Wayne Flury called a brief meeting to order.

The secretary's report (minutes in the current newsletter) was approved as printed. The treasurer's report was also approved as presented (see a summary at the end of these minutes). Wayne noted that Mike Wiskus had asked for assistance of chapter members at the Buffalo Fly-In on Sunday, June 17 to help with aircraft parking and crowd control for the air show. Tim Bond and Dave Swanson agreed to contact Mike for details and to coordinate the other volunteers. Wayne has a prior commitment at the Canby Air Show and will not be at Buffalo. The chapter decided against setting up an EAA info booth.

Wyatt Erickson and his father Tim attended the meeting. Wyatt had asked the chapter for financial assistance with the tuition for an Air Academy Camp at Oshkosh. The chapter voted to contribute to Wyatt the same amount as last year...\$135. Note: EAA has previously had funds available to award "scholarships" to campers. This year their funds are limited and Wyatt did not receive a "scholarship" as he has in the past. Wyatt has solicited funds from other sources as well and this amount, in addition to the chapter Young Eagle credits

and other contributions and money donated individually by several EAA Chapter 878 members, was sufficient to cover the full \$920 tuition charge for him. Wyatt presented the chapter with a "Thank-You" card and served a cake he had brought!

As a follow-up to the Air Academy Camp donation, Wayne presented a proposal and a motion for the chapter to establish a "Scholarship Fund" from which future contributions to requests can be made. Wayne suggested that the Scholarship Fund be funded by a yearly assignment of a portion of our fly-in profits and also that individual members could contribute directly to it. The motion was seconded and passed to establish the fund.

Fred then displayed his American Champion rebuild project to the chapter members. It's a model 8KCAB, with 150 HP with constant speed prop. He's doing a great job on the rebuild. Fred also showed photos of his visit to the American Champion factory.



Following Fred's presentation, Bruce Halverson, a retired US Navy friend of Fred, gave an interesting discussion about his knowledge of Navy operations and drones.
