

We have all the parts to build the airframe and then will select instruments and an engine. When completed it will be sold and the monies used to continue to build our 2 RV-4's to kits. We implemented the electronic signature application on the iPad we purchased with our 2021 Young Eagle Money. The Main chapter supports chapters like 878 that have a Young Eagle program. They monitor the Young Eagles flown by a Chapter and will reimburse the chapter for an approved Young Eagle expenses. The amount we are allowed to spend is based on the number of Young Eagles flown the previous year, x \$5.00. We have a little over \$300.00 available from the 2021 Young Eagle flying and we were able to purchase an iPad and Electronic Stylus for use in our program.

The next event is May 13<sup>th</sup>, come prepared to wish my Wife Amy and Happy Birthday that day. We had several pilots sign up to help so the current number of students allowed to fly is 36, and we are filled up. There will be a lot of kids getting in the air that morning. ### Ray Scholarship Airspace by Kyle Weatherly

Several exciting updates on the Ray Scholarship for 2023

- The nationwide average cost for flight training has increased, so the Ray Scholarship is now a scholarship worth \$ 11,000.00 instead of the 10,000 it was before.
- The Chapter matching program has also been changed, so now instead of a chapter having 50% cost obligation, it will now be 25% of the overall cost. That means that we may be able to apply for this program in the future. Depending on how our scholarship fund builds over the next year.
- Now the big reveal, on 2/24/2023 I received an e-mail from the EAA that approved our application for 2023. EAA 878 now can actively look for a candidate to support for the Ray Aviation Scholarship for this year.

I have sent out e-mails to youth that are potential Ray Scholar Candidates, and we have received some responses from that e-mail. Applications are currently due on May 6, that was 3 weeks from the date I sent out the e-mail about the Ray Scholarship.

In September 2022, EAA Chapter 878 celebrated a major milestone in our history by holding the first "Official Chapter Meeting" at the Maple Lake Airport in the new-to-us hangar owned by the chapter (see photo to the right). This was after we got a new concrete floor and sealed the roof, but with full knowledge that much work still lay ahead of us if we are ever to have a 4-season-useable facility.

Since then, we've had a contractor install a metal ceiling in the hangar (see photos in another article in this month's newsletter). Still to come is insulation, additional lighting, and interior wall covering along with insulation and electrical outlets. And, if we are to ever utilize the hangar during colder times of the year, a heating system. We've also got the goal of adding onto the hangar with a classroom, perhaps even including a kitchen with running water and a restroom!

These tasks might seem daunting, and no one member should be considered responsible for doing them. These are chapter tasks. We will work together to get them done.

A common denominator for the things I've listed is...money.


