
Member Spotlight by Tom Rammel


Our guest speaker, Sharon Sandberg, is a business owner, entrepreneur, education promoter, and aviation advocate in Princeton, MN.

- Flight Expo, Inc. (see: <u>https://flightexpo.org/</u>)
 - ✓ Build-A-Plane. an interactive program allowing students to build a full scale aircraft. It teaches students different mechanical skills such as welding, riveting, fabric covering, and similar aspects that are used in aircraft construction. Students in the Build-A-Plane program also have increased access to the Flight Expo Flying Club, where students may fly aircraft and take flight training lessons or study ground school in order to become a pilot.

- ✓ Flying Club: for youth that want to obtain their FAA private pilot's license
- ✓ The Tsunami Project: restoration project whose primary objective is to inspire the next generation and introduce them to the world of aviation. Tsunami is an experimental purpose-built racing aircraft, designed to break the 3-km world speed record for propeller driven aircraft and to compete in Unlimited class air racing. It was, and still is, the world's fastest home-built race plane ever built. It was built and flown by Minnesota industrialist John R. Sandberg, Sharon's father.
- ✓ STEM education. Flight Expo is a proponent of STEM education and offers students access to learning opportunities in the STEM fields of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics.
- ✓ Airframe and Powerplant Classes. Classes added in 2021 to the Build A Plane program and challenging those to learn more by working towards an Aircraft and Power Plant Mechanic License
- ✓ Wright Flyer replica. Flight Expo organization was responsible for the construction of a full size reproduction of a 1903 Wright Flyer replica as part of the United States Centennial (the 100 year anniversary) of Flight. This aircraft was on display in the Twin Cities area since 2003.

Tree of Hope 2021

32 years of providing toys for children hospitalized over the winter holidays.



- Who is involved? Tree of Hope was started in 1990 by a group of aviation enthusiasts who saw a need to support hospitalized children and their families through a difficult time. The program has grown over the years and has supplied up to 40 hospitals across the state of Minnesota and northern Wisconsin with toys. Tree of Hope is supported by EAA Chapters, Minnesota 99's, Zuhrah Shrine Flyers, Minnesota Pilots Association and Flying Clubs as well as individuals/families.
- Toys or monetary gifts are collected by flying groups all over the state. These toys are brought to a central collection site to be sorted and distributed to the various hospitals, all by volunteers so 100% of any monetary donations are spent on toys.
- Ways to participate: Set up a toy donation box at your local FBO, have a party and ask friends to bring toys, talk to your flying group/EAA chapter etc to become involved.
- We are looking for toys for infants to 18 years. Anything that they can use while in the hospital – board games, craft kits, dolls/trucks, books, hand held games, etc. Fly or drive the toys to the central toy collection site.
 - Often times we are short on infant and teen items
