MEETING,
Aug. 8, 2012**

17 members and friends of EAA Chapter 878 met in the meeting room of Wright Aero at the Maple Lake airport on the evening of August 8 for our monthly meeting.

The evening began with a presentation, both verbal and video, by Eric Spoon about his experiences flying in Alaska and Indonesia. Eric and his family will be leaving Minnesota around the end of August, relocating to Thailand and working in mission service with Free Burma Rangers (see: <http://www.freeburmarangers.org/> for more information on this program).

Wyatt Erickson took center stage to tell about his experiences at Air Academy Camp at Oshkosh in June. He had many stories and photos to share, and it's evident from his enthusiasm that he benefited from the program. The following Monday was Wyatt's 14th birthday, so he brought a cake (homemade, as befits an EAA group!) which he shared at the conclusion of the meeting.

The Treasurer's Report by Dick Burns (see summary at the end of this report) and the Secretary's Report by Wayne Flury (minutes of last meeting, as published in the newsletter) were both approved. Tim Bond passed around copies of a hand-out regarding proper hand signals to be used by persons working with aircraft parking.

Glen Morrow noted that he has a Young Eagles event scheduled for a group on Saturday, Aug. 11. He has pilots and ground crew lined up, but additional help is always nice. Glen encouraged members to not wait for a group event... members can conduct a Young Eagles flight with just one kid, and these are some of the most memorable flights!

Elaine Morrow noted that the 99s are having a Poker Run on September 22 and will send the info to Wayne for general distribution to the entire chapter. She also described an opportunity to participate in a NIFA (National Intercollegiate Flying Association) flying competition to be held at Mankato in October. If you would like more information about this, please contact Elaine or Patti Sandusky.

Dave Swanson discussed his progress on his SeaRey amphibious experimental aircraft. He is very pleased with the quality of the kit.

Discussion of upcoming Chapter 878 fly-in: Dick Burns has the pop and water already purchased (all "on sale"). Joe Simmon will check with Fred Jude about handling the procurement of pork chops, beans, potato salad, etc. Last year we got 600 chops and sold out. The same number is expected for this year. Wayne will handle press releases to local papers and radio station. Tim Bond will handle aircraft parking, and others volunteered to assist. The Ericksons will direct car parking. Glen Morrow will coordinate with Bill Mavencamp about the hangar floor cleanup. Marv Sikkila will purchase plates, utensils and buns. Dave Swanson and others will cook chops. Dick Burns noted that Marcie will handle the cash box for tickets. Marv will have a prop clock for the raffle, but noted that this will be the last one he will make. Marv has been doing this for about 20 years (even he isn't sure!) so if our "prop clock raffle" is to continue, someone else will need to learn this skill. Tim Bond will check with local emergency responders to ask about having them pre-positioned at the airport. Chapter members will handle general airport cleanup on the Saturday prior to the fly-in.

Joe Simmon will check with EAA about possible chapter liability for anyone other than the chapter that provides airplane or helicopter rides during our event.

Please remember – all chapter members are needed to help work at our Fly-In on Sunday, September 9. Yes, it is work, but it's also a lot of fun. We are well known for this event and it's our only fund-raiser. It's also our biggest "out-reach" event to introduce the general public to EAA and Chapter 878.

It is difficult to describe Oshkosh AirVenture to someone that has never experienced it first hand, but it is an amazing experience. Over 500,000 friends and aviation enthusiasts attend. There are 10,000 aircraft to look at as well as KidVenture, seminars, workshops, speakers, and a museum to experience. There is a wealth of entertainment in the evening, including the Steve Miller band and the movie Red Tails that can be viewed, not to mention a 2-hour air show every day. This is the busiest airport in the world for one week each year. There is so much to do that you can never see or do everything.

I was a volunteer with the control-line group again this year, and it was good to see some familiar faces and new ones, too. For those of you not familiar with control line or KidVenture, children of all ages can fly a control-line airplane for free. Some years that can mean 2000 people flying them. Moms and Dads and even a few Grandpas even give it a try. Flying the airplane consists of flying in a circle while holding the handle attached to the airplane by control lines...the airplane can climb or dive by maneuvering the handle, which operates the elevator. The young kids do not get dizzy, but some of the older kids (parents or grandparents) do!

The airplanes we use are called the Tough Baby and were designed by the St Louis control line group. These airplanes are very tough and fly very well even in the wind, and we had some wind this year! These airplanes hold up very well and survive most crashes due to the tough design and rubber band mounted engine mount.

I worked on the pit crew, re-fueling and starting engines. Another pit crew member launches the airplane and the pilot gives the kid flying it some brief training, helping them to be successful on their first flight.



At 11:30 a.m. each day, some very experienced control-line volunteers fly a demonstration that is very impressive. Most of these volunteers are current or past national control-line champions.

After the demonstration, a prize-winning drawing is held for all the kids that flew that morning. The prize is a kit for a control-line model airplane donated by SIG manufacturing.

The remaining pictures are of some kids flying and also one dad (big kid) flying the airplane.


