CONTINUING STEM EDUCATION AT ROCKFORD SCHOOLS by Kyle Weatherly

I've had correspondence with Corina Sarsland, the teacher Kurt had been working with at Rockford Middle School over the years. Now that Kurt has departed to Colorado, I agreed to continue participation in the STEM program as a representative from EAA Chapter 878. She told me she and the school are excited to honor Kurt by continuing this partnership. She has also registered her son for our next Young Eagles event.

This school year they have three dates on which to work with the Exploratory Program on flight – the dates are Sept 30, Jan 21 and March 2. Morning sessions run from 9:50 am to 11:45 am, and afternoon sessions are 1:53 pm to 2:45 pm (different students in each session).

I can't guarantee that I'll make all these dates myself. We should bring it up to the chapter and create an Aviation Day type of presentation based on what Kurt has started. We can develop this and promote it as another thing we can do with all the local schools.

Last year I gave presentations at Dassel/Cokato and St. Michael - maybe we can get something going in all the schools (assuming we have some people stepping up to help). I know that Tom Rammel is working with Dassel/Cokato students on aviation projects. His commitment is more than I can do at this time but schools might be interested in this one day type of program.

Let me know if you're interested in being a part of our school outreach into their STEM programs. I can give you an overview of the classroom program and help get you set up.
