Here is an interesting article that I came across in Flying Magazine. It discusses the pilot shortage, the time it takes to get the younger pilots out of the pipeline and into the Captain's seat. This touches on two of the methods Congress is considering, lowering the flight hours required. A few regional carriers are asking congress to look into lowering the 1500 hours to 750 hours. Note: Some schools and Military experience has the minimum hours at 1000 to work for a carrier service. The other item being considered right now is raising the mandatory retirement age from 65 to 67, Congress did this once before when they raised the age from 60 to 65 in 2007. GA Flight Safety Airspace by Laura Herrmann

After Market Safety Equipment

The installation and use of after-market safety equipment can greatly reduce the likelihood of some GA accidents. These new technologies include restraint systems and angle of attack indicators, among others.

One of the most important types of safety equipment is your restraint system. Many still fly with a single belt restraint system but adding shoulder belts or a five-point restraint system gives you the best chance of sustaining minimal to no injury in many circumstances. Air bag restraints are also an option for some planes.

Angle of attack (AOA) inhibitors have recently become available and affordable for GA aircraft. This technology can go a long way toward reducing the number of stall/spin accidents. The process of producing these devices and retrofitting planes has been streamlined by the FAA.


Original Charter Member Of EAA Chapter 878



I was born on Dec 31, 1948. My earliest memory of airplanes was in the early 50's my dad owned a Aeronca Chief that was based in Minneapolis Wold Chamberlain field. I remember a flight in that aircraft with my Dad. Shortly after that the aircraft was destroyed in a Tornado at the Minneapolis airport.

That one ride had kindled my interest in airplanes. In 1960 the Maple Lake Flyers flying club had started operations at Maple Lake. Initially they had acquired a Taylorcraft BC12D aircraft. It was kept at Monticello at the Nick Flynn operation. Shortly after that the flying club managed to find some ground to put a grass field in at Maple Lake. it was very short and located on top of the hill just south of


