Is the Aiming Point actually the Touchdown point?

My grandmother, for whom English was not a first language, said "time, it's like a fly." At nearly the end of June, we've had 6 issues of the 878 Newsletter fly by. The feedback I've seen suggests that some change in my contribution might better serve the group. As we grow in maturity (i.e., get older), we're faced with changes that can enhance our performance as pilots as well as some that challenge it. Inevitable slowing of some cognitive and/or physical capabilities can be balanced by hard-earned judgment and motor-memory skills that accumulate inversely proportional to colored scalp hair. Other changes are less related to aging, and rather a function of illness or injury. Many of these bring intense concern and practical implications. But pilots may not always be motivated to mention some of these to their aviation medical examiner (AME) or even their primary care physician, for fear medical certificate ramifications. Even with Basic Med, there still may be need for special issuance and/or self-assessment to evaluate PAVE or IMSAFE checklists. Member Spotlight by Kurt Weimer



on my cuts. Eventually my skills lead me to building gas engine powered U-controlled line planes.
