Online Scholarship for EAA 878 Wright County Graduates is online for applicants to use. Please remember this is open to any Wright County graduate from the (9) High Schools, and One Charter School we are aware of. Home schoolers in Wright County will be considered as well.

Online application is accessible through our EAA 878 Chapter Website.

In 2022 EAA 878 was able to give (3) \$1,000.00 scholarships to three exceptional candidates. The candidates were from Buffalo, Monticello, and St. Michael High Schools.

Number of scholarships will be determined by applicants and the amount of money in the scholarship fund.

I have filled out the online application for the Ray Scholarship. The chapter has to apply for the opportunity to host a Ray Scholar every year. Our request is under review at this time.

If selected as one of the chapters, the Ray Scholarship will be open again in February 2023. Ray Scholarship opens up in November every year. This is for all chapters that have the funds to run a matching program for their candidate. This means the Chapter puts up \$ 5,000 and the Ray Scholarship adds the remaining \$ 5,000 when they submit a Ray Scholar. Maybe someday our chapter will be in this financial situation but for now we wait until February, or later.

The scholarship we apply for is for the full \$ 10,000 for our candidate. The chapter administers the funds but doesn't provide any chapter money to the candidate.

Our Scholarship committee will be looking for potential candidates during the first part of 2023.




six siblings, we were brought up to always volunteer our spare time in the betterment of civic organizations. Boy Scouts, church and trade associations were always a part of our lives.

We never had a family interest in flying. In fact, my grandparents refused to fly in either GA aircraft or with commercial airlines. "Too dangerous" they would say.






