

During a seven-day period, October 15, 1950 — October 21, 1950, CAA put into operation the first omnirange (VOR) airways. During 1946, the agency had applied wartime technology on an experimental basis when it converted eight radio range stations on the New York and Chicago airway to VOR omnirange stations. As a result of those tests, CAA adopted the VHF omnirange for standard use and began general installation of the new system in 1947.







CHAPTER 878 HANGAR F-3 UPDATE

In September the upgrade work on our "new" hangar at Maple Lake began. Fred Jude and Pete Radintz used their personal construction equipment to dig out and haul away the old "blacktop" floor, then brought in fill material for grading and leveling the base. A chapter work party on September 8 got the base prepped, and concrete was poured on the 11th.

Following are photos of the work as it progressed. The main posts of the hangar were in generally good condition, with only two needing new wood reinforcement.


This is just the beginning. The roof has some

leaks (very obvious during the recent hard rains!), and the hangar door needs to be adjusted to fit the new floor elevation. Future improvements/up-grades are for the roof and then interior work (ceiling, insulation,

electrical, wall board, etc., etc.). More work parties will be called as the Hangar Committee determines and schedules the next phases.

We will need members with skills and experience in construction, as well as folks to supply labor under supervision.
