Do you have students that are very interested in interplanetary travel? If so, do they have any idea of which colleges have study programs in these fields of endeavor? Here's a good list for them to consider, along with some of the awards they've received from the NASA RASC-AL Competition. That stands for Revolutionary Aerospace Systems Concepts – Academic Linkage.

University of Puerto Rico, Mayaguez: 1st Place Award for Multi-Purpose Rover design (MISSION MARS). And an award for Multi-Purpose Rover for expanding Surface Science (EMPRESS).

Georgia Institute of Technology, Atlanta: 2nd Place Award for Mission Impermanent Surface to investigate our neighbor, Mars. And another award for Short Surface Stay Mars Mission.

University of Texas, Austin: Lunar Engraver with Geological Autonomous Carving Instrument (LEGACI). And Excellence in Commercial Innovation with same (LEGACI). Also, an award for Space Development with themes of Tourism, Minerals Extraction, Internment/burial, and In-Situ Resource Utilization or ISRU and propellant production. Read more > 5 min read

Online Scholarship for EAA 878 Wright County Graduates is online for applicants to use. Please remember this is open to any Wright County graduate from the (9) High Schools, and One Charter School we are aware of. Home schoolers in Wright County will be considered as well.

Online application is accessible through our EAA 878 Chapter Website.

In 2022 EAA 878 was able to give (3) \$1,000.00 scholarships to three exceptional candidates. The candidates were from Buffalo, Monticello, and St. Michael High Schools.

Number of scholarships will be determined by applicants and the amount of money in the scholarship fund.

As of writing this we have no applicants at this time. We typically start seeing applications start in March.

Several exciting updates on the Ray Scholarship for 2023

- The nationwide average cost for flight training has increased, so the Ray Scholarship is now a scholarship worth \$ 11,000.00 instead of the 10,000 it was before.
- The Chapter matching program has also been changed, so now instead of a chapter having 50% cost obligation, it will now be 25% of the overall cost. That means that we may be able to apply for this program in the future. Depending on how our scholarship fund builds over the next year.
- Now the big reveal, on 2/24/2023 I received an e-mail from the EAA that approved our application for 2023. EAA 878 now can actively look for a candidate to support for the Ray Aviation Scholarship for this year.

Our Scholarship committee will be looking for potential candidates during the first part of 2023.






