

- **MINUTES OF MEETING – March 14, 2015**

Monthly meeting of the EAA Chapter #878 called to order by President Greg Thomes at 9:15 AM at West Metro Aviation in Buffalo, MN. The chapter reflected on the recent passing of Don Kruse.

OLD BUSINESS:

Bill Mavencamp, Sr. Memorial: Glen Morrow met with Maple lake city officials. They will bring up "naming rights" at one of their future city work sessions.

Thumb Drive Purchase: Tom Rammel provided the chapter with 12 thumb (USB flash) drives of past chapter videos. They may be checked-out...but these should be returned.

Boy Scout Camporee at Buffalo: Greg Thomes reported that the date is set for about 700-900 boy scouts to meet at KCFE on May 30th. EAA Chapter 878 will be responsible for handling one station of the Scouting Aviation Merit Badge...most likely using the chapter's flight simulator. Tom Rammel feels that the flight simulator will be working properly then. Plans are still being ironed out to have a box constructed for the simulator.

Buffalo Fly-In: West Metro owner, Mike Wiskus spoke to Greg Thomes regarding the June 7th, 2015 Buffalo Fly-In and Pancake Breakfast. He is confident that our chapter will do another good job again and looks forward to having us as his breakfast hosts. A committee meeting for the pancake breakfast will be held prior to the next chapter meeting.

Maple Lake Fly-In: Kent Peterson reported that the Gear Head committee has been meeting and that the pork chop fly-in will be held in conjunction with their event on August 15th. EAA is mentioned better than last year on their posters. There will be 2 busses shuttling people back-and-forth to the airport running simultaneously. The drivers will be using radios. The Gear Head committee will be sponsoring one of the busses. Chapter #878 will need to sponsor the other bus. Kent P will co-chair this portion of the event. He also checked with Jason Erickson to make sure that the main hanger is available on August 15th.

This would enable our group to construct an airplane. They also brought up the possibility of finishing a plane that is presently not fully constructed by one of our own members. Discussion ensued addressing ownership of a plane. Our chapter may not own the plane. However, other pilots may own the plane...or the plane could be raffled off with proceeds used to re-start a second building project.


- FRIENDS OF THE BUFFALO AIRPORT (FOBA)**

- NICHOLAS-BEAZLEY AVIATION MUSEUM**

One of the benefits of having friends and relatives know you are interested in aviation is that, when you visit them, they will likely point out airports and museums in their area. It was thus that I was introduced to a very interesting museum with high quality displays in Marshall, Missouri. My wife, Joyce, and I were there last month to visit her cousins and we were treated to an "after hours" tour of the museum by one of their friends who is a volunteer (and a "mover and shaker") at the museum.

After World War I, Russell Nicholas began a business in Marshall selling surplus airplane propellers and in 1922 formed the Central Aviation Company. In 1923 he partnered with Howard Beazley in the NB Motor Company (automobile business) which was short lived as they shifted their focus to the aircraft industry. In 1924 they formed the Nicholas-Beazley Airplane Company and by 1927 were the largest distributor of airplane parts in the United States. Reportedly, some of the parts used in the *Spirit of St. Louis* were purchased from them! In 1927 they hired an airplane designer, Walter Barling, and began producing his monoplane designs.



The Nicholas-Beazley Aviation Museum tells the story of Nicholas and Beazley and the community of Marshall. It features restorations of a NB-3 and NB-8 aircraft and many recreations of the Nicholas-Beazley manufacturing facility in Marshall. Nicholas and Beazley also partnered with Ole Fahlin, an early innovator and manufacturer of advanced propeller designs. The Museum features a display of some of his wood propellers and the carving machine. Other aircraft on display include a Flying Flea, and they are developing a World War II exhibit. A "Young Aviators" area had me wishing for more time to play with the flight simulators and other educational tools for youngsters. And, of course, there is a gift shop.

The thing that impressed me so much with this facility, beyond the quality of its displays which reminded me of those at the Oshkosh EAA museum, is that it was built as part of the Martin Community Center, a recently constructed community and event center. This ensures that the exhibits are continually exposed to a segment of population that might never otherwise consider stopping into a museum.

Marshall, Missouri is located approximately 60 miles east of Kansas City, and is within one driving day or an easy flight. I know I didn't have enough time to fully see and appreciate the museum and would like to return for another visit.
