

Those that actually read our newsletter will know I haven't been very diligent about my Monthly articles. Here is an update of what is happening with Amy and I.



Want to help us build a Speed Record Setter?

A Sonex kit-built aircraft like the one pictured here and like the one our EAA Chapter will be building with the help of students from around the Wright County area set a speed record in 2023!



This speed record was set on March 31st, 2023. It's a "Speed Over a Recognized Course" record in a Class R aircraft (microlight) of which the Sonex qualifies. This is not a World Record, but a record recognized by the National Aeronautic Association, a National Record! The flight course was round trip from Pensacola Florida to Pascagoula Mississippi.

The 70 nautical mile flight from Pensacola Florida to Pascagoula Mississippi took 43 minutes and 28 seconds at an average speed of 110.58 miles per hour! The return flight from Pascagoula Mississippi to Pensacola Florida took...Read more > 1-1/2 min read



Soft Field Landing

SOFT FIELD OPERATIONS

- Set yourself up for success. This begins with a stabilized approach. Proper airspeed and energy management is crucial.
- Once you cross the threshold you want to hold the aircraft in ground effect. Bleed off as much energy as possible before touchdown.
- Let the wings support aircraft weight as long as practical.

 Ground effect will vary between low wing and high wing aircraft.
- Maintain back pressure on the yoke and hold the nosewheel off as long as practical. Continue back pressure until you've come to a stop or onto a hard surface.
