

#### Is CPAP the Only Show in Town?



Recently, a pilot was heard to say that he could not tolerate continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP) prescribed for obstructive sleep apnea (OSA). His moderately severe disorder caused some excessive daytime sleepiness. He was at risk of mimicking the pilots who overflew their Hawaii destination several years ago when they both fell asleep as a result of untreated OSA. The responsible pilot should selfground to prevent this or a worse outcome until the disorder is successfully treated. If flying with an FAA medical certificate, a special issuance (SI) is required, based on documentation of effective therapy. At the time of the next

FAA physical, the pilot should report the disorder to the aviation medical examiner (AME) and on the MedXPress form. Read more > 4-1/2 min read



## Member Spotlight by Roger Bovee


Like many of you, I was introduced to aviation by family members who were also in love with









These show the recently completed installation of the donated sheet metal (THANKS, Dick Borrell!) on the ceiling of our Chapter Hangar (Aviation Education Center). This adds immeasurably to the appearance of the inside of the hangar. This old place is really getting spruced up!



Aircraft hangars always look best when there is a pretty airplane sitting inside. The one shown in these two photos is a Bellanca Viking owned by chapter member Pete Radintz. SWEEEET!

Shown below is a detail of the ceiling intersection with knee braces from support posts to the main trusses (a common structural necessity in wider span buildings such as a hangar). Also, the contractor provided a very nice (and a very much needed safety enhancement) enclosure for the hangar The sheet metal, which Dick had salvaged from the roof of a building that received hail damage, worked out very well to become a ceiling.

Our contractor, Ben Vogelpohl Construction, did a great job of installing purlins and other support structure into the existing roof trusses. They put in a plastic sheet vapor barrier and were able to very effectively use the metal sheets. While the sheets do still have small holes where they were previously installed on a roof, the outcome looks very good. Now, just wait until we can get some proper lighting in there!





door counterweights. They also boxed in the openings for the door lift

mechanism and provided access hatches into the attic.

The next improvement projects coming up, as funds allow, are planned to be lighting and insulation.


