GA Flight Safety Airspace by Laura Herrmann

The startle response may lead to loss of control in flight and aircraft upset. When startled, pilots may react by freezing, fighting, or fleeing from the situation. Training for these unexpected situations can reduce the startle response time and allow better response to emergency situations.

After the Cogan 3407 loss of control accident Congress enacted the Air Safety Act of 2010, which mandates loss of control training along with Upset Prevention and Recovery Training for pilots employed by air carriers.

There is no requirement for Part 91 pilots to have this training, but it sure sounds like a good idea! So, go find your favorite CFI to work on this, or maybe even get some spin training!


FAA Wright Brothers Master Pilot's Award Ceremony




I started flying in 1969 when a WW2 P-47 pilot named Wally Pawelski saw me at the Gillespie Field, CA airport fence and offered me a ride in a Piper Cherokee. He taught me to fly using the WW2 US Army system. I immediately joined a local Boy Scout Aviation Explorer post and I soloed in a C-150 in late 1970 in high school at Gillespie Field, CA. I have flown approximately 300 types and models of various military/airline/GA aircraft with approximately 12,000 hours of flying time.

I entered the USAF Academy in July 1971 and graduated in June 1975, being the cadet Aero Club

president, captain of the Academy intercollegiate flying team, leading the team to their first national championship. I was awarded the Top Pilot award in my class. USAF Undergraduate Pilot Training (UPT) was done at Reese AFB in Lubbock Texas, then fighter lead-in training at Holloman AFB, and on to F-4E school at MacDill AFB, FL. I spent 3 years flying F-4E's in Europe, including temporary tours as an instructor for the Turkish and Egyptian Air Forces, and a year as a NATO headquarters planning officer. During that time, I flew exercises with the RAF, Italian, Turkish, German, French, and Norwegian Air Forces. <u>Read more > 8 min read</u>

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
