# GA Flight Safety Airspace by Laura Herrmann

Tools To Monitor Aircraft Performance Monitoring

As pilots, we tend to have unreasonable expectations of the performance of our airplanes, which can contribute to fatal accidents. However, we can mitigate these expectations by using flight data monitors which can help forecast potential problems before they become serious enough to cause an inflight problem. Changes in performance can be a sign of developing mechanical issues and can be discovered through the use of data monitors.

Your POH can help you predict performance, but only by monitoring your own airplane's performance, will you be able to develop reasonable performance predictions and expectations. The simplest of these monitors are our basic instruments, such as airspeed indicators, AOA indicators, manifold pressure, and RPM indicators. Many GPS and flight apps can record position, speed, heading and altitude. Other good tools are engine monitors such as those made by JPI and EI. Oil analysis by a company such as Blackstone are also valuable in monitoring your engine's health.




# Member Spotlight by Dick Borrell


