This camp is open to Minnesota students who will be entering 10th, 11th or 12th grade, and allows the students to explore a wide variety of aviation careers and all aspects of the aviation and aerospace industries through tours and hands-on projects. Campers are also given the opportunity to fly in a helicopter, pilot a single-engine aircraft, and take the controls of a glider. Dates for the event this summer are June 21-27 and July 19-25.
