MEET LEAH PINONIEMI – one of the world's newest Private Pilots by Wayne Flury

This year 2020 has been one of struggles and sorrow. But yet we still hear stories of achievement and fulfillment that give us hope for the future. This is just one of those stories...

Leah Pinoniemi is a young lady who discovered a passion for aviation and invested a significant amount of effort into learning to fly. If you are a pilot, you know about accelerated stalls. If you're a student, you know about the availability of accelerated learning programs. Leah jumped into flight training and took the concept of accelerated flight training to a whole new level.

You may have previously seen Leah's name in regard to EAA Chapter 878's scholarship program. She is one of four student applicants who graduated from a Wright County high school (three were selected by our chapter) and received a scholarship to assist her in an aviation related educational program.

No one in Leah's family is a pilot, so her introduction to general aviation didn't come until she was a Young Eagle participant in May 2019, riding with chapter member Chris Glaeser in his RV-7A. In September there was another Young Eagle experience with chapter friend Bruce Topp. Leah took things further with a Discovery Flight at Inflight Pilot Training at Flying Cloud airport in October, and then had another Young Eagle flight with Kyle Weatherly, one of our chapter Young Eagle Coordinators.

Things got serious on May 11 2020 when she started flight lessons at Inflight. She didn't solo until July 23, but took (and passed) her Private Pilot checkride on August 6...just a few days more than 12 weeks after beginning lessons. Accelerated training? Oh YEAH!!

I asked Leah what her thoughts were when she first took the airplane controls from the left-hand seat on her Discovery Flight. Her answer shouldn't surprise anyone! "I was like Wow! I'm in control – how crazy! I had so many questions in my head...I wanted to know everything. I was so excited and motivated to become a pilot!"

August 6, 2020, new Private Pilot Leah and her instructor Sara Weidler (Leah also flew a few times with Chapter 878 / IMC member Ambyr Peterson)

Leah continued: "I had a part time job all summer. I nannied 3 days a week and I would study and read while my kids were napping. I would fly after work and on my off days. In the beginning of my training I would do one flight a day, then go home to continue my online ground lessons. Once I was done with the Sporty's (Ed. Note: Leah, as an EAA Student Member, had free access to Sporty's *Learn to Fly Course*), I started to do 2 lessons a day. and then sometimes I would squeak in a third lesson."

With this degree of determination, you might expect the next goal or step on the aviation ladder to be a big one. It is. Leah explains, "I wanted to go to Mankato State University for a Commercial Pilot study program, but it isn't possible for me this year, unfortunately. The expenses have delayed me. I will be working to afford

my own flight training on the side now and I hope to become a flight instructor! I loved coaching gymnastics and now I can't wait until I can share more of my passions with others someday! Once I have enough hours my dream is to go into the airlines."

While her academic career (and the chapter scholarship) might currently be on hold, I think Chapter 878 can be very proud of Leah's achievements and fully expect her to be successful on whatever path she chooses to take. With young members in our society such as Leah, the trials of 2020 will be overcome.

It's interesting to consider the value of more than one Young Eagles experience, particularly for older participants. Leah had three YE introductions, from three different pilots, all flying different airplanes. If she had been limited to just one experience, would the connection have been made? Perhaps, but the benefit of the second and third ride, certainly in this case, was made. And I'd bet that she becomes a Young Eagle pilot in the future! Keep an eye on this young lady – she's going places!

Author's Comment: Leah's story is not a typical pilot training program, and is certainly an achievement worthy of a virtual "high five" from the entire chapter. Leah has now joined a special group of people! Welcome!! But it's also important to keep in mind that whether Leah, you or I needed 12 weeks or 12 years to reach our aviation goal is not the point. Earning a Private Pilot license (or any other life goal) is a challenge subject to our individual circumstances. Keep at it, keep aiming for that prize. And if that prize happens to be a flight rating, you may eventually find yourself taking training from Leah!


