FLY-IN AND CLASSIC CAR SHOW - SATURDAY, JANUARY 18

Plans have been finalized for this popular annual event. Ron Erlinger has put together an exciting group of cars. The Town of Wickenburg has negotiated to have two food venders as well as the popular "Kettle Corn" vendor. Glen Floe has sent out the invitation to pilot groups, airports and the military. We expect to have another good showing of airplanes, cars and spectators.

Our chapter will be helping in several important ways. We will be advising in-coming and out-going traffic (remember Brent Wenger did this last year). We will be directing aircraft to and from parking and we will be working the sign-in booth for visiting pilots. All pilots who fly in will receive a free "Breakfast Ticket".



We have a large group of chapter members who have volunteered for this important event. All EAA volunteers need to arrive at the pilot's lounge at 6:30 AM on Saturday, January 18. Coffee will be available along with Safety Vests and last minute instructions. All persons involved in parking MUST WEAR A SAFETY VEST.

GROUND SCHOOL 2025

As a result of having the "Adult Eagle" event in November we have recruited four students who are interested in attending a ground school. Margaret Sucher, CFI, will be conducting the weekly classes and students will use Sporty's On-line Private Pilot Course. Classes will be held every Wednesday morning at the Wickenburg Library starting January 15. The goal of the ground school is to prepare the students to take the required FAA Knowledge Exam and to prepare them for their flight lessons. Each student will be assigned a mentor who is expected to keep in touch with the student, encourage them in their studies and keep them interested in flying. The students are: Mike Clancy, Bryon Zacher, Sheryl Christy, and Karl Tayler. Each student will receive a 6 month membership in EAA and will be reimburshed \$175 for the cost of the FAA Knowledge Exam.

TREASURER'S REPORT. KAREN CHAPMAN

Note: At the December meeting many members were surprised to learn that we do not have enough money in our treasury to sustain our chapter. No one ran off with our money! We just don't have enough revenue to cover our modest expenses. This concern has prompted our Treasurer to prepare the following report.

We currently have \$1,689.52 in our checking account. In 2024 we collected dues from 44 Members for a total of \$440. We can expect to collect at least that much in 2025 and maybe more since we have more people attending and on our roster. To date we have collected \$290 for 2025 dues, but it is not yet deposited into our account. This would bring our account balance to \$2,129.52. \$500.00 of this is dedicated to the Monroe McDonald Scholarship Fund. This means we really only have (providing everyone pays their \$10 this year) \$1,629.52 available.

So, anyone with half a brain can see that we spend more than we take in every year. At this rate we will only be able to operate for another 3 years. So, we are proposing that dues be increased in January 2026 to \$20 per member.

In the past spouses were not charged Chapter dues, BUT if spouses want to pay a membership fee, we would be more than willing to accept it.

If you have not already paid your 2025 dues, please plan on doing so at the January meeting.

Note: Paying Chapter dues does not make you a member of EAA. To receive the benefits of EAA membership a person must use the EAA on-line membership form and pay \$48.00 per year. In order to serve in a chapter office, fly Young Eagles or Adult Eagles, receive the benefit of insurance coverage at EAA events, receive reduced fees at Air Venture, receive "Sport Aviation" magazine and take advantage of many other benefits a person must be a member of EAA.
