
# Young Eagles

#### **Young Eagles:**

The EAA Young Eagle online registration system has been initiated for our 2022 Young Eagle events. I have entered our five selected dates and location into the system. We have May 14th at Troutdale, June 11th at Mulino, July 16th at Lenhardt's, August 13th at Troutdale, and September 17th at Mulino. All events have been entered into the system, however it only posts the next 3 months from the current date. So the only event that shows as of right now is May 14th at Troutdale. As the months progress, the 3-month window will slide and the next event will show up, and May's will be listed as well until May arrives and passes. I hope to present an overview of the system at the next chapter meeting March 9th.

#### **Ray Scholarship:**

As previously announced, our chapter has once again has been selected to offer an applicant the \$10,000 Ray Scholarship in 2022. We have 4 young men that are interested in applying for the scholarship. All of them are currently at various stages in flight training. #### Mt. Hood Chapter 902 Experimental Aircraft Association

#### General Meeting February 8th

President Pete Gauthier called the meeting of Chapter 902 to order at 7:02 PM. Approximately three dozen members and guests were present. Pete introduced the Board Members and Officers. Guests included Brian Wing, Alec Schmidt, Brian Russell and Mark Burnham.

**Fly-outs:** Henry suggested flying to Nehalem this Friday to camp out or to WAAAM (Hood River Airport) for their second Saturday event.

Washington Pilots Association SW Chapter is doing a Taco Tuesday Fly-out to Mulino Airport on March 15, 2022, from 4:00 PM - 6:00 PM at the Mulino FBO building. All visitors are invited to join them.

**Speaker**: Dave McGraw is a retired Air Force pilot. He now is at Valley View, where he has purchased an RV8 kit including wings, tail and empennage from a couple in Estacada. She works at Vans Aircraft and he is retired.

Dave said that he was raised in Estacada on a farm. When he was a kid he used to watch the military aircraft fly overhead. He saved his money and went to Skyways to learn how to fly when he was a teenager. Later he went to OSU on an ROTC college scholarship. When he graduated, the military was in a cutback mode and told them that only a small percentage of them would be able to fly. He felt fortunate that he was among those selected to fly fighters. He flew T-37s and T-38s in training. Later he was assigned to Kadena Air Base in Okinawa. He flew with the 67<sup>th</sup> Squadron known as the Wild Weasels. As the lowest ranking officer, it was his job to care for the Philippine fighting cocks.

In the air, they were "First in and last out." They flew F4Gs. Later he was with the 26<sup>th</sup> Aggressor Squadron, where they flew F5s. Pilots were hand-picked to join the Squadron. They studied Soviet philosophy and language. They were experts in air-to-air combat. The purpose of the group was to fly and understand Soviet fighter tactics and requirements.

He completed a staff rotation analyzing aircraft acci-

dents and writing reports. He also flew F15s. They debriefed after every flight and were required to recognize to every mistake they made and commit to not making the same mistake again. The F15 was a good air to ground fighter, but also a good air fighter. It has a side stick controller that is governed by computers. It carries heat seeking missiles.

They trained all the time. They were prepared to carry "nukes". Their planes had lantern pods on them that allowed them to see things on the ground such as power lines, owls flying or sitting on posts. One time he had to bail out of a jet in a flat spin and was injured by the ejecting canopy.

**Website:** Cody provided an update on the website. Keith sent a group email regarding the website. The Club Roster, Bylaws and Young Eagle events will be posted. Next month Cody will provide a demo of how the website operates. Cody has asked for pictures of events, airplanes and members to post on the website.

**Demonstration**: Ken Williams demonstrated how to weld a cable using a propane torch and an electric drill. Welding the cable prevents it from fraying.

**President's Comments**: Pete has requested that members bring photos of their current aircraft to display in the Clubhouse. Ken Williams offered some 8" X 10" frames for people to use.

902 is still looking for a Young Eagles Coordinator. Dan Forney reported that the club is going to use the EAA online system for registering Young Eagles. He reported that ten pilots signed up to fly kids, but ground crewmembers are still needed. Pilots can designate how many kids they will fly on any given date and how many events they can participate.

Albany's Northwest Art and Air Festival planners would like to keep the Young Eagles event going. The former Young Eagle's Coordinator is not available to coordinate the event at the Festival. Pete will follow up with them further.

NW Aviation Conference and Trade Show in Puyallup, WA occurs February 26 and 27, 2022.

Len Fierling coordinated the 50/50 raffle. Steve Miller was the lucky winner.

**Ray Scholars:** Luke is working on preparing himself for the Private Pilot written examination. Gavin has passed the written examination and is preparing himself for his check ride.

Adjournment: Meeting was adjourned at 8:25 PM.

**Program:** Next month Dan will go through the process for signing up Young Eagles online. Phil Groelz will provide a Tech Tip. Cody will provide a concise presentation on the website. He will work with Dan to get the Ray Scholarship information posted on the website.

Larry has been asked to do a program on Prop balancing as the flying club has the Dyna-Vibe equipment to do it – possibly as a Saturday activity. Larry responded that there are some really good videos on how the equipment and process works.

Keeyan Robles may be a potential speaker for our group. He was an OPA scholarship winner who earned his private pilot's certificate and later went on to graduate from Embry Riddle where he became a helicopter pilot and instructor. He is now employed in the Pacific NW. Board members were also interested in getting someone from Van's Aircraft to speak, hopefully about the newest plane in their line-up, the RV15.

It was suggested that we raffle off the airplane model in the clubhouse that is just gathering dust at this time.

**Website:** The Bylaws were posted on the old website. The Club's roster is password protected and will continue to be protected on the new website. **Air Academy:** Dan talked with the staff at EAA Headquarters and was told that we were guaranteed a slot for Brandon Slater who has been waiting for two years to attend. This is the last year that he is eligible to go.

**Young Eagles**: It was recommended that we update the Chapter's business card and include information in how

to sign up kids for the Young Eagles events.

**Ray Scholarship**: Dan advised that he would hear sometime this month if our Chapter has been approved for another Ray Scholarship.
