Mt. Hood Chapter 902 Experimental Aircraft Association

General Meeting January 12th

Newly elected President Pete Gauthier called the meeting of Chapter 902 to order at 7 PM. Approximately three dozen members and guests were present. Guests included Dave McGraw, who is a professional pilot and Mike Karst.

Several guests were present that expressed an interest in the Ray scholarship including Cameron Miller; Ashton Carlson who is currently taking lessons at Lenhardt's from Tom Wrolstad; and Kevin Roundsville, who has already soloed at Troutdale. In addition, Vernon Meade and his parents were in attendance as Vernon has expressed an interest in aviation. Vernon is not yet old enough for the Ray scholarship so he is interested in learning about other aviation related activities including EAA Academy and Young Eagles.

Ray Scholarship and Young Eagles Program: Dan Forney spoke about the Ray Scholarship and the Young Eagles Program. The Young Eagles Program is designed to introduce young people between the ages of 8 and 17 to aviation through an introductory flight, which is free. An aviation oriented company named Sporty's has partnered with EAA to provide a free online private pilot ground school course to all Young Eagles. Once the Young Eagle has successfully completed the course, he or she is eligible to take the FAA private pilot written examination.

The Chapter has been successful in obtaining four Ray Scholarships. The first scholarship was awarded to the Chapter in 2019 and the recipient Shyla Williams successfully earned her private pilot certificate. The second scholarship was awarded in 2020. Brandon Slater was the recipient of that scholarship and he too successfully earned his private pilot's certificate. In 2021, Gavin Burn was the recipient of the Ray Scholarship and is still working on his private pilot's certificate. Later in 2021, the Chapter was notified that a second Ray Scholarship would be offered to us if a candidate was available. Luke Palau had previously applied for the scholarship and he became the fourth recipient of the scholarship. He has been taking his training at Lenhardt's. The

Chapter has applied for a scholarship for 2022 and will learn in February if one will be granted.

An update on the Chapter's Ray Scholars: Shyla has been accepted into the Horizon Development Program and received a \$10,000 Blackburn scholarship from WAI (Women in Aviation International) to use towards advanced ratings. She is also on the cover of the Ray Scholarship handbook. Brandon Slater was selected by NASA to ask a question (live) of the astronauts on the International Space Station (ISS). He also is close to obtaining his tail wheel endorsement. Gavin was the star of a webinar on the program. Luke soloed December 22, 2021.

The Ray Scholarship Program has requirements for its recipients. EAA wants the recipient to get involved with the Chapter that sponsors them. They are expected to volunteer two hours a month with the chapter that sponsors them. This can include attending meetings, writing updates for the newsletters, volunteering at Young Eagles events. The recipient is expected to schedule three lessons each week, knowing that some of them will be cancelled due to unavoidable circumstances, i.e. weather, health, family matters etc. Requirements include first milestone is the solo. Second milestone at 6 months is passing the written examination. Third milestone at one year is completion of the private pilot check ride. The recipient and parents are required to sign an agreement that they understand and will comply with the requirements.

Lightspeed has provided 90 headsets per year to all scholars that complete their first solo (first milestone). This year due to the number of scholarships and the fact that Luke's scholarship started late in the year, the Ray program ran out of headsets. As a result the Chapter opted to purchase the headset and presented it to Luke this evening. He was surprised and expressed his gratitude to the entire Chapter.

Flyouts: Henry flew to Estacada to help Doug Snader dig his airplane out of the snow. Flyouts are usually scheduled via email to let people know where and when the event is going to occur.

Speaker: Dick Scott gave a presentation on the History of Chapter 902 and a bit of his personal history with the Guard. Chapter 902 started at Troutdale in 1987. Steve Miller, Keith Pugh and Dick Scott were some of the

original members and Dick was the original president. They did not have a regular meeting location at Troutdale so moved to Mulino in 1998 where they shared the Oregon Pilot's Association clubhouse until they were able to obtain their current clubhouse. The Chapter made arrangements with the State of Oregon that owns the building to mow at the airport in exchange for rent. Builders' group and technical support were started to assist members that were constructing or rebuilding aircraft. When Paul Tidball moved up from California, he helped set up the Young Eagles program for the Chapter.

Dick talked about his personal aviation history. He got involved in Civil Air Patrol and purchased an Interstate Cadet aircraft that was rebuilt and flown for a number of years. During his stint with the Guard, he worked in testing and analysis. As part of the NATO activities that the Guard was involved in, he served in Anchorage, AK, Iceland, east of Edmonton, Alberta, and Turkey. They had planes from all over the world at these events. During the 9/11 attack, all military aircraft were activated to a certain level of readiness and he worked full-time for them for nine months.

Website: Cody provided an update on the website. He is working with EAA National to have our site operational through the national website. He asked for members to email pictures for him to post on the website. He is working to get a simple re-direct from the current website to the new address.

President's Comments: Pete noted that many of the aircraft members that are flying are not represented on the walls of the clubhouse. He asked members to bring current photos of their aircraft to be on the walls.

Next Meetings: Board meeting will be at Elmer's in Clackamas on Wednesday January 29, 2022, at 6 PM.

Next regular club meeting will be Wednesday, February 9, 2022, at the clubhouse.

Dick Scott will continue to coordinate the Builders Group at this time.

Young Eagles: Tony Hann contacted the Chapter to provide a Young Eagles event at their Albany Art and Air Festival. The event is August 26-28, 2020. The EAA Chapter that was in Albany has disbanded and no longer will be coordinating that activity. Pete will follow up with Tony to see if Chapter 105 was also contacted and what would be the expectations for participation. 902 is still looking for a Young Eagles Coordinator. It was decided that the Chapter would schedule five Young Eagles events this year, which will be the weekend following the meeting.
