#### Sten Check-in (From August)

This month has gotten off to an eventful start! Got through my preparations for my first solo XC, and it didn't exactly go to plan. After a nice trip to Albany, I learned from the ATIS that TTD had their runway shut down. Ended up landing at Mulino instead, and it was definitely an exciting first solo XC and a good story to tell! Now that I've gotten that out of the way, the rest of the month is ticking off the last boxes I need for my PPL requirements so next month we can focus on check ride prep. It's looking to be a good month!

Last month I mentioned the water running across runway 34/16 at Valley View airport in Estacada. It seemed like a real issue to me as I don't really need any extra obstacles to deal with on my take offs and landings. After the flight back from Cottage Grove, I put on some sandals, grabbed my push broom and headed off to the source of the problem. Walking along the creek on the east side of the runway, I found a well built beaver dam. There is normally a nice pond over there but this raised the water level about 2 feet, enlarging the pond and causing the runway overflow.

Using the push broom's handle as a prying tool I busted up the dam and flung the branches, weeds and mud in all directions. Also, in the back of my mind, I was keeping an eye out for possible enraged rodents that might not be too happy with what I was doing. The previously dry creek was now filling it's banks and I felt pretty good about my work until I started wondering if it was causing issues down below in the new subdivision being built around the airport. I never heard anything so I guess not.

Several weeks later I was back at the airport and the runway was dry and looking good. I was feeling pretty proud of myself for taking care of this problem until Ralph, one of the residents there, stopped by my hangar to chat. The local airpark residents had knocked down the dam 2 more times since I was there. The beavers had rebuilt the dam I destroyed by the next day. Apparently, the only reason the overflow stopped is that the rains finally quit in July. I'm buying boots and a pick axe before October.
