Some have broken the sound barrier; some have applied bug-killing chemicals to plants. A great number of you have even built your own airplanes. Some are in the process of just that. Every section of aviation has its own strengths, and yes, its weaknesses. Ask a C-5 pilot to fly a Pitts and it will likely get ugly. Ask an airline pilot to file his own flight plan and negotiate with flight service when the tower is closed. Ask a Light Sport pilot to do the ILS PRM into San Francisco on a dark and stormy night.

We have such a great opportunity to learn from each other. And, to be honest, this is something I think we do fairly well. I am impressed by this chapter's internal cohesion. And this is something I hope to encourage. We should be able to learn from each other. We should feel that our ideas and contributions are valuable. I think we all want this chapter to grow and for us to keep learning. Keep them coming!

HANGER FEASIBILITY STUDY AT UNITY AERODROME Sc76

We are doing a feasibility study of building 8 to 10 T-hangars at the Unity Aerodrome. The

hangars and the airport runway would be owned by a LLC, which is inturn owned by the participants. Each participant would own or lease one or more individual hangars and be responsible for their prorata share of runway and common area maintenance/upkeep.

As the airport is in Lancaster county, the taxes on your airplane and hangar should be significantly less than the same size hangar at Rock Hill. As the property is to be owned, not leased, your ability to sell your hangar in the future is enhanced.
