

#### **Presidents Corner**

Hopefully everyone has renewed their membership for 2025. We have a lot of activities happening this year.

#### Hangar Update:

Location Discussion – Some members asked if we could move the location to the end of Four Points by the runway where the dirt piles are located now, This is not possible for three major reasons, First we can't get a ½ acre there as it is only 99 ft deep from the road to the drainage ditch across the runway and that will not allow future ability to put in a septic system. Second, I have heard from many that they do not want the hangar blocking the view from the picnic area to the runway and the rest of the park. Third, by locating the hangar on the corner of Wingover and Four Points there will be more room for parking without visitors having to come into the park. They can park in the mail center area as well as in front of the hangar.



The current plan is to raise enough funds to do the site preparation so we can pour footings around the hangar so that we can erect the hangar and enclose it. Then we can work on funding to pour the pad inside the building. If we can get the forms set we believe that the cost for rebar and concrete is about \$5,000. To that end we have been working on fundraising and so far, we have either cash or commitments for \$3,000.00. We are offering challenge coins for a \$20.00 donation to the hangar fund, we are also offering a place for businesses to advertise inside the building. Currently we have priced this advertising at \$500.00 per year for a 2 ft by 4 ft banner/ sign. If you would like to donate or know someone who would like to advertise, please contact one of the chapter officers.

As soon as I know when we need to take down the hangar from its current location, we will have to get a team together to take it down. We think it can be accomplished over a weekend.



On a different topic, we are considering having the chapter business meeting separate from the monthly gathering. According to headquarters, this should make the gatherings more fun as we can spend more time socializing and shorten the overall length of the gathering. All members are welcome to attend the business meetings, and we will publish location as soon as we determine how often and where these meetings will take place. We will provide a quick report for the membership at gatherings, but not hold discussions.

There is also a discussion about the chapter doing a pancake breakfast at Oshkosh as a fund raiser. More on this later as plans get developed.

#### This Month's Question and Answer:

**Question:** You're on a VFR cross country flight in your VFR-equipped 1977 Cessna 172, flying by pilotage at about 3,000 AGL, on your way home with a friend. You're returning later than planned, and your friend asks if he can use his cell phone to call his wife to say he'll be late. Since you're flying VFR and not even using any onboard electronic navigation, is it legally permissible to let your friend make the call?

### 25 Papa

Most people involved in aviation can tell you about that special airplane or flight that truly is unforgettable. I'd like to share one with all of you. This is a bittersweet memory for me.

The story is about a Piper Tri-Pacer, N3925P, that my brother Mike owned when I was young. We lost him to cancer, some years ago. My sister Barb was also with us for this flight, and unfortunately she has also recently passed away due to complications from Parkinson's disease. The memories are mixed.

Mike was my oldest brother, and to say I looked up to him would be an understatement. He was a pilot when I was a boy wanting to be a pilot, and he owned an airplane when I was a boy dreaming of owning an airplane. You get the picture. (Though as I often say in the hopes of being accurate, I now know that it is the airplane, or *airplanes*, that own me, not the other way round)

While I cannot be sure, I am fairly certain the flight was also in January, as I know we cleaned snow off the wings before departing Morey's Field (C29) in Middleton, WI. The destination? The EAA Museum, then located in Hales Corners, WI. Since Hales Corners closed around August 1977, this had to be earlier than that.

According to EAA, "While our annual fly-in & convention moved to Oshkosh in 1970, our headquarters remained in Hales Corners, WI, until the opening of the EAA Aviation Center, including what was then known as the EAA Air Adventure Museum, in 1983." My guess is this was January of 1977.

N3925P was not exactly a show plane. She was old and tired, she lived outdoors at a tie-down, and she had a musty smell. But my brother owned her and cared for her and I fell in love immediately. My first flight into the EAA Convention (fondly referred to as "Oshkosh" and now named AirVenture) was in the back of that airplane.

The sounds and smells of flights in 25 Papa are etched in my mind, though the years have mixed them all up. The sight of my brother reaching over his head to adjust the trim was enough to have me mimic the behavior in the back seat of my mother's car every time we drove. His Ray Ban sunglasses and the smile on his face every time we flew are unforgettable. The sound of the engine, the wind on the fabric, my brother talking to me...

Years later, Mike owned a Luscombe, and that was definitely a show plane!

I cannot tell you much about the flight to Hales Corners, other than it was cold in the back of the Tri-Pacer. If I recall correctly, the runway was grass and I remember we parked across the street from the museum. (I confess to having cheated and looking this up to be sure - see this website for some history about the airport)

I can, however, tell you a lot about that museum visit! As a young boy who was enthralled with all things aviation, the museum was a magical place. At the time, the museum was a bit less "perfect" than what we see in Oshkosh. The buildings were full of aircraft and artifacts, but it



was the person that I met there that I remember most.

I did not know it then, but I do now. I met EAA Founder Paul Poberezny for the first time that day (though certainly not the last). What I remember most vividly is he took the time to talk to me, ask about my interest, and had a warm smile and a spark in his eyes as we talked.

He seemed genuine and I remember him explaining something about the airplane we were looking at, although admittedly I do not remember what he said. But I definitely remember the man.

What is etched in my mind is the museum. Vividly. The aircraft seemed to have stories to tell, and each one was unique. If I recall correctly, the museum building was a pale mustard color

with sunlight filtering in among the displays. My memory may be fading and the details could be wrong...but I found images at <u>this link</u>. It matches my memories, for what it is worth.



We spent part of the morning and into the early afternoon wandering through the exhibits. Soon enough, it was time to go, and we departed in 25 Papa. A stop for lunch on the way home (Grand Geneva or Lake Lawn Lodge probably) just added to the adventure.

I'm sure I have muddled up some of the memories I am sharing, and I am equally sure the story is neither unique nor exciting. But I hope each of you that takes time to read (which is probably 5 or 6 of you) has your own memories to lock away and share one day. Aviation does that - makes memories.

For me, writing this brought back many, some good, some more difficult. In 2015 when I made the first flight of my Sonex, I know I had a copilot in the empty right seat. I know Mike was there with me, making sure I didn't screw up...While flying my first Young Eagle of 2022, a young lady known as "M.E." was in the back of the Champ, bundled up and toughing it out. I thought back to those flights in 25 Papa, and what it meant to me. I was up front grinning like that little boy in the back of the Tri-Pacer. *Thanks Mike*.


# From the Right Seat
