


From the Vice President

How about those Magnetos?

If you are flying a certified airplane, you more than likely have a Lycoming or Continental engine and these engines are powered by 120 year old technology, the magneto. There are only two manufactures of magnetos: Slick and Bendix. They both work on the same principle and use the same technology internally. The reason we have two mags per engine is that they are prone to failure. According to Mike Bush's experience he calculated that the magnetos fail at a rate of one failure per year per 100 airplanes, that is not considered very reliable. These were the same ignition systems that were put in a model T-Ford and the internals have not changed much. Of course, automotive technology has had some technology upgrades since then, the magneto has not.

The FAA however, has seen the light and they have allowed a new piece of technology in the form of Surefly an electronic replacement for a magneto.

Magnetos do need maintenance and when we do an Annual inspection we check if the magneto works properly, we check the timing, and if the magnetos are grounded when the switch is in the off position. Although the 500 hour magneto inspections are not compulsory for part 91 operators, it is a good idea to have the magneto opened up and serviced. At that time have any worn parts replace and the point gap reset. Remember that the old technology, we had in our cars, needed to be serviced and points and distributor cap replaced every 5000 miles.

If you send your mags out to get them serviced, make sure you ask for a 500-hour IRAN (inspect and repair as necessary). Rather than an overhaul there's typically no need for magnetos to be overhauled except when the engine is undergoing a major overhaul.

When the time comes to overhaul/servicing the mag, you may consider, upgrading to an electronic ignition. An overhaul will cost you about \$1100 and a new Surefly \$1755. So, the difference is not that much, less than one "aviation unit".


