Editorial Notes by Larry Gordon

The month of June starts the Chapter's summer format with the beginning of "Fly Nights" on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday nights, 5:00 p.m. until the "street lights come on". Tuesday June 11th (originally scheduled for June 4 - postponed to June 11 due to weather), the Merrill grill meisters will be starting off the season at KRRL, followed by John Szigat hosting the Chapter on June 18th, at Langlade Co. Airport. Special thanks to Dick Neitzel, our "Fly Night" coordinator, and all of this year's hosts, as well as those working behind the scenes. Now it's up to us Chapter members to show our appreciation by joining in the comradery in hopefully the warm and beautiful Wisconsin evenings, making it all but a dream come true from potentially the "best seat in the house" - your cockpit!

Hey, how about that wind we had for our May Chapter meeting in Merrill last month! Having taken off from Wild Rose(W23) with the Waupaca AWOS reporting 160@04, I

envisioned a leisurely flight to Merrill for the monthly meeting, with thermals developing as the day progressed. Climbing to my cruising altitude of 2,000 ft. was brief before climbing to 3,500 ft. looking for my thermal "sweet spot". Once there, I noticed more rudder pressure was needed to maintain my course with less thermals. But, I had picked up almost 25 kts. of airspeed on the tail!

Changing radio frequencies to monitor local traffic didn't reveal anything out of the ordinary, but the AWOS out of downtown Wausau airport was reporting 170@7G11. Then I heard traffic on 122.8 saying, "I guess I can write that down as two landings", from AC landing in Merrill. Now I was perking up to the fact that more attention was needed than visual scanning and radio traffic checks.

With more planes landing at KRRL shifting to Rway 07/25 and a variable wind direction on AWOS, I followed suit, which led me into burbling



winds at the end of Rway 07, and an increase in throttle to offset the braking effect of the increasing wind gusts. How I didn't collect a double on that landing, or necessitate a BVD change, is still baffling.

After a renewal of friendships from over the winter, and an informative meeting, along with an all-American hot dog lunch, it was time to slip out of the tie downs and head'er home. Watching V.P. Dan's takeoff for LORD gave me an idea of how my flight was going to go - rock and roll! As I broke contact with the asphalt of Rway 34, I heard a familiar voice ask if I was rocking my wings to say goodbye! As I reached for an overhead cockpit frame member to help anchor my butt to the sheepskin, answered "soytainly", before starting to repay the piper for my expedited flight to the meeting.

Slow and steady was the theme for the flight home to W23. Kinda like survival mode



- staying in the air without causing damage to self and plane. I found myself equating the plane's rivets to my abdominal muscles, so throttling back was the procedure of the day, for then. My landing option was 1695' Rway 18 with its approach over mature pines to the runway cut out of the woods. The Wau-

paca AWOS was reporting 165@14G19. After flying the last hour into the wind, turning downwind and crosswind to final was another treat! A go-around, like testing the waters, is always an option, but one I really didn't want, so when I had the runway made but high, I dove down for the runway cones, and found the wind funneling

straight down the mowed turf channel through the woods. The headwind was enough to arrest my speed for what felt like the great landing that all landings are!

Steve then talked about Emergency Approach and Landing Procedures - time to be a glider pilot, at moderate cruising altitude. The 8 steps are:

- 1. Pitch for the best glide speed.
- Pick a spot to land (commit to it unless there is a closer, better spot)
- 3. Turn to the spot.
- Try to restart the engine (only if there is time). (Memorize your restart checklist)
- 5. Call for help (transponder 7700 and announce "Mayday" or emergency frequency 121.5).
- 6. Aim for your key position.
- 7. Fly a normal pattern (a little tighter pattern).

8. Prepare for landing (turn off fuel supply, electrical master switch, and magnetos, open doors before landing).

Discussion on options of where to land and things to do for off airport landings followed.
