## Editorial Notes by Larry Gordon

The weather forecast was for partially clear skies, with temperatures in the "no preheat required" zone, and winds in the single digits for a change. It could be my last chance to fly for the next three weeks. But, that shouldn't be such a big deal because my log book says that I haven't flown in the last eight weeks, due to various reasons. Thank goodness, the dog eating my plane was not one of them!

Regressing to last month's newsletter about knocking the rust off my decreased flying proficiency and the dust off my checklists, I opted to not schedule a check ride with my instructor because of the impromptu nature of the day. Instead, I meticulously inspected the plane, checklist in hand. All looked good except the cleverly hidden duct tape partially covering my oil cooler, used to increase engine temps in winter. After calling two airports for their AWOS reports to confirm my visual weather observation, I towed the plane out of the hangar to continue proceeding towards becoming airborne. Next checklist.

Having completed my pre takeoff checklist and sitting at the end of the runway with the cockpit all secured, I made my final instrument and air traffic check before advancing the throttle. At that moment I could feel my facial muscles tighten as I put on my "Cheshire Cat" smile in anticipation of chasing the horizon. And we're off! Soon, I'm over the trees and with a little rudder/aileron action for the slight crosswind, I am up and away in what I consider "my little piece of heaven".

With no pre planned destination in mind after flying the Wolf River to check walleye fishing boat traffic, I decided to head for the Shawano airport while overflying the river. A quick aerial survey of Shawano Lake put me on a left downwind for EZS Runway 12. A single tire yelp on the new asphalt surface kept that flying smile on my face all the way to the terminal.

After checking out the facilities in the new terminal building and signing the airport register, I was greeted by a familiar older face that I had often seen in the old terminal, which had been replaced by a new facility about 5 years ago. After self introductions, my conversation with Clarence Schampers covered his historic connection to the



airport and his background in aviation. Our brief conversation led to a next day phone call with Clarence elaborating on his Shawano aviation connection, with my urging questions. Before long, we were "hanger flying" with the best of them.

Clarence Schampers began taking flying lessons prior to being drafted into the Navy in the 1960's, and was stationed at Naval Station Great Lakes for his two year military obligation, during which time he continued taking flying lessons. After the service, he used his GI Bill benefits to further his aviation training, which included his instrument rating, commercial pilot license, flight instructor license, flight instrument instructor, and multi engine rating. His path led to Shawano as owner and operator of Shawano Flying Service, as well as airport manager, in 1971, until 2021.

This is just an abbreviated bio at best. Clarence is a true ambassador of Shawano, as well as a local aviation historian. My luck seems to never run out when it comes to meeting those individuals that nurture our desires to

Steve talked about how important it is to be vigilant with the sun angle and not always relying on electronic devices to see what is outside of the plane.

We discussed an article on the Golden Rules of Aviation:

- 1. For the Pilot in Command: Get a good and timely evaluation with a good instructor who knows your airplane. At that time you should review emergency procedures.
- 2. For the Airplane: When did it fly last? Each flight needs a good preflight inspection. Washing the plane is an awesome preflight inspection.
- 3. Be Vigilant-do a double look.
- 4. Never operate with a known malfunction, better to wish you were flying than to be flying in the plane and wish you were on the ground.
- 5. Do a pre-flight weather review. Establish minimums visibility, winds, etc.
- 6. Navigation Planning Establish a safe altitude for flight. Have current charts for your route. Know the airspace and frequencies needed.
- 7. Address your takeoff and landing limits. Never quit flying until the chocks are under the plane.

- 8. Wind limits. Be ready for the unexpected.
- 9. Physical condition of the pilot needs to be considered each flight.
- 10. Hand propping starting procedures. Always brief your passenger.
