Pretty easy to romanticize yourself at the controls of a twin turbine powered Otter. A comfy heated cabin, lots of

reliable power and your aircraft is supported by the very latest navigational systems. Now roll your calendar back to 1932, outside temps hovering at minus 61, your open cockpit biplane is setting on the Kuskokwim River and vou have 350 miles to fly to get to Fairbanks.

Noel Wien made that all day flight right after the oil gage needle showed a little warmth. A firepot under a heavy blanket thrown over the engine provided that heat. After yet another night at 65 below Wien, pressured by his passenger, an attorney, decided to make the flight to Fairbanks.

Takeoff oil temperature in the Wright J-6 registered at 120 degrees and as the flight proceeded the engine temp dropped and remained at 100 degrees. Not a lot of lubrication happens at that temperature but they made it to Fairbanks, cold sweat all the way. Wien's final challenge of the flight was to find the Fairbanks airfield.

Smoke and heat from house chimneys had caused a localized thermal inversion, no field in sight. Noel Wien put his Standard D-25 down



"right side up in a small clearing beyond town". At the time of this flight Wien established an unintentional record of cold weather flight. In his narrative describing this event he also takes full credit for taking unnecessary risk and using poor judgment.
