I called President Steve this week to ask if he knew of anyone in the chapter who might stand-in for me if needed, at least for a

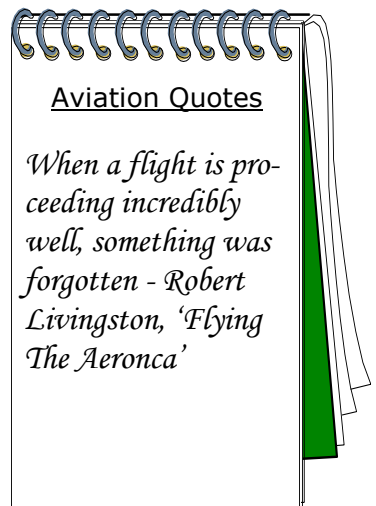

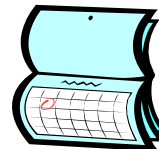

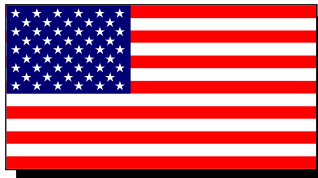
