

AirVenture 2025 Mass Arrival Schedule Set



Again in 2025, a number of aircraft type groups will be arriving at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh together, continuing a tradition that has been part of Oshkosh for many years. These arrivals are organized by individual groups in consultation with the FAA and are part of a unique tradition at the World's Greatest Aviation Celebration.

This year, the mass arrival schedule is as follows (all times Central):

Saturday, July 19

• Mooneys - 10 a.m.

Bonanzas - 1 p.m.

Cessnas - 5 p.m.

Sunday, July 20

• Cirrus - 10 a.m.

Cherokees - Noon

These mass arrivals take 10-20 minutes each, with other arrivals on hold during those periods. Other aircraft should be aware of these dates and times and plan their Oshkosh arrivals accordingly.

Additional Oshkosh arrival information will be available in the FAA NOTAM for EAA AirVenture Oshkosh, which will be released in May by the FAA.

EAA Promotes MOSAIC in Deregulatory Comments

EAA filed comments in response to a Department of Transportation (DOT) Request for Information (RFI) asking the public to identify "existing regulations, guidance, paperwork requirements, and other regulatory obligations that can be modified or repealed," consistent with the administration's goals on deregulation.

While EAA identified several unnecessary regulations that can be amended or repealed, it also took the opportunity to prominently feature Modernization of Special Airworthiness Certification (MOSAIC) as an example of a "relieving regulation" – a rule that, while adding physical rules to the rulebook, actually allows more freedom and flexibility within the aviation industry. EAA believes that prudent deregulation in aviation necessarily involves relieving regulations alongside repeal of overly restrictive requirements.

"MOSAIC will usher in a new era of low-cost pilot and aircraft certification, with a level of FAA oversight commensurate to the operation," EAA's comments said. "Neither EAA nor the greater general aviation community views this new rule as creating new regulatory burden – quite the opposite."

EAA Vintage Chapter 22 was formed in August 1990. This marks John Morozowsky's 35 year as President!

To date, I have not found a longer serving President.

Airplanes and Automobiles on Saturday August 23rd, 2025, 10 AM - 4 PM at KUCP New Castle Municipal Airport (PA) returns for the second year in a row. This event will feature 5 food trucks, a Chinese auction, car show, fly in, 50/50 raffle, helicopter and airplane rides. Several local EAA chapters like to attend and be a part of the adventure. Runway 31/13 will be closed - Airplanes and Cars will park on that runway while the longer more wind favored runway 23/5 will be used for landing and departing traffic. Trojan Phlyers flying T-28s make their Cleveland debut this summer!

The Trojan Phlyers will make their Cleveland debut as they roar through the skies. Flying two T-28 Trojans, this demonstration will display the cutting-edge performance of the T-28s. Flying with Wright Cyclone engines, these T-28s can climb to 10,000 feet in less than 90 seconds, race level above 335 MPH and dive faster than 380 MPH!

Rich in military history and heritage, both aircraft were used by the U.S. Navy, entering service in 1956. After their respective tours, the aircraft were sent to the Military Aircraft Storage and Deposition Center at Davis-Monthan AFB in Arizona then purchased and restored.

General and Business Aviation Call to Action: Airport Familiarization
Notice Number: NOTC4406

Reminder: Familiarization with your Destination Airport is Important

The FAA and the aviation community are committed to pursuing a goal of zero serious close calls and improving situational awareness in the airport surface environment. Be sure to utilize all the tools available and get acquainted with your destination airport before you takeoff.

1. Arrival Alert Notices

To manage wrong surface events where an aircraft lines up to or lands on the incorrect runway, taxiway, or airport, the FAA released Arrival Alert Notices (AAN) at airports with a history of misalignment risk. AANs are graphics visually depicting the approach to a particular airport and language describing the risk of misalignment. You can view the complete list of AANs at www.faa.gov/aan.

2. From the Flight Deck

The FAA's From the Flight Deck video series (https://bit.ly/2Mj0Cme) provides pilots with actual runway approach and airport taxiway footage captured with aircraft-mounted cameras, combined with diagrams and visual graphics to clearly identify hot spots and other safety-sensitive items. The videos also provide advice for pilots on how to mitigate the risk of runway incursions and wrong surface events.

To supplement the videos, the FAA also publishes additional "Pilot Handbook" content. This includes details such as airport-specific cautions, information local controllers want pilots to know, airport communications, airspace details, and other preflight planning resources. 3. Aeronautical Charts

Aeronautical charts are the road map for a pilot flying under VFR. The charts provide information that allows pilots to track their position and provides available information that enhances safety. Always review your destination's Chart Supplement to become aware of any special aviation activities, traffic patterns, or obstructions. Prepare for your next flight by checking the charts at www.faa.gov/air traffic/flight info/aeronav/digital products/.
