## **Applications Now Open for 2024 EAA Aviation Scholarships**

The application process is now open for the 2024 EAA Aviation Scholarships. Flight training and post-secondary scholarships are available to everyone over the age of 16. The window to apply will close on March 1, 2024.

Flight training scholarships help cover the costs at any flight school in the United States or Canada that is not a university program. Post-secondary scholarships help pay for collegiate level programs in the United States including but not limited to aerospace or aeronautical engineering, aviation business administration, air traffic control, aviation maintenance, professional flight, or any aviation-related STEM field.

“The costs of training and education can be one of the biggest challenges students face when trying to achieve their goals,” said Becca Greskoviak, EAA scholarship and fund steward coordinator. “EAA is able to help break down that barrier through our scholarship program.”

## **Free Admission for Ages 18 and Under at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2023**

Young people ages 18 and under will be admitted free to EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2023, to introduce more youths to the possibilities in the world of flight. The 70th EAA fly-in convention will be July 24-30 at Wittman Regional Airport. Free youth admission is supported in part by The Boeing Company.

This effort is designed to encourage more aviation-minded families and their children to attend the event that brings more than 10,000 aircraft from around the world to Oshkosh each year.

Free youth admission is available throughout AirVenture week. Longstanding youth activities and programs at AirVenture include such popular offerings as the hands-on Kid Venture display and program area; technology, innovation, and education options throughout the grounds; and extraordinary events such as daily air shows and hundreds of forums, workshops, and seminars.

If you are planning on going to AirVenture, consider doing Chapter Camping. Each Chapter is allowed 2-6 sites. These sites are marked off in advance from Saturday, July 15 through the end of AirVenture. At least one member of each site needs to be a member of National. This is a great deal in that your site is marked off for you. The first person in the Chapter that arrives at AirVenture gets the campsite credentials for everyone in that Chapter. Then when you get close, you call that person, and they meet you at Camper Registration with them. No standing in line to pay for your campsite and then driving around to find a site that is not marked off already.

It is with great sadness that the Vintage Aircraft Association announces the death of VAA Director Emeritus Bob Lumley, who passed away on Tuesday, January 30th, 2024.

A native of Athens, Georgia, Bob retired as vice president of a Milwaukee-based construction firm. He soloed in 1968 in a Piper PA-11 and held a commercial pilot certificate. Bob was a lifetime EAA and Vintage Aircraft Association member. He was also a charter member of VAA Chapter 11 in Brookfield, Wisconsin.

A volunteer since 1981, Bob designed and managed the construction of additions to the iconic Vintage Red Barn, the Vintage Hangar, as well as other Vintage buildings. For years Bob also managed the Red Barn Gift Shoppe. Bob was also a volunteer at Pioneer Airport, participating in its Young Eagles program with more than 300 missions. He served as Santa for the EAA AirVenture Museum "Christmas In The Air" program and was on the Vintage Nominating Committee. Bob served as Chairman of Vintage Pioneer Video during AirVenture. In 2009 Bob was a recipient of EAA's President's Award.

All applications are reviewed against the criteria for the individual scholarships and then awarded to those who show the greatest potential to be actively engaged in aviation.

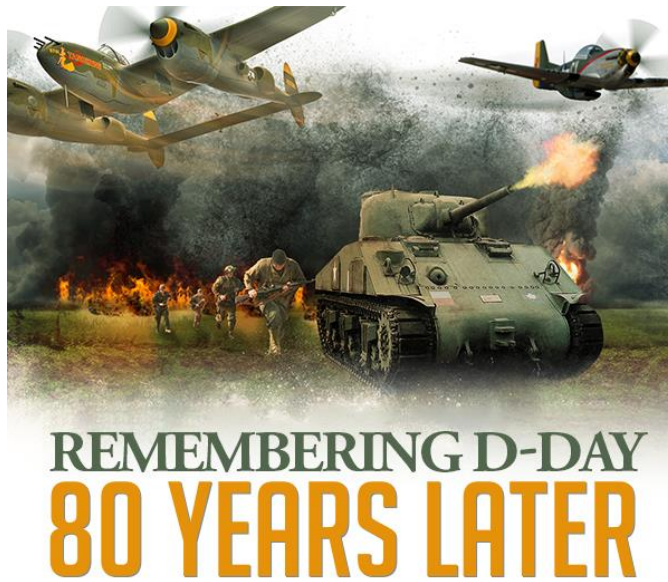
Awards are made up of the following funds:

- Being a member of EAA and a member of an EAA chapter will make your application stand out.
- Volunteering for local organizations, both aviation and non-aviation related, will also highlight your application to the selection committee.

## Top Air Show Performers Commit to EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2024

Some of the world's top air show performers have made commitments to fly at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2024 – the World's Greatest Aviation Celebration – as part of the afternoon and night air show lineups.

Performers at the 71st EAA fly-in convention, scheduled for July 22-28 at Wittman Regional Airport, include aerobatic champions and longtime Oshkosh favorites. The event features nine air shows over seven days, including night air shows on July 24 and 27. Daily afternoon air shows are presented by Daher and Pratt & Whitney, while night air shows are presented by Covington Aircraft (July 24) and PenFed (July 27).;

“Whether it’s during the afternoon or night air shows at Oshkosh, the performers who fly here are headliners who are among the best in the world,” said Rick Larsen, EAA’s vice president of communities and member programs, who coordinates AirVenture features and attractions. “The air show community knows that the AirVenture crowds are the most knowledgeable anywhere, and appreciate the skill and precision necessary to fly these aircraft to the edge. That brings out the best in these pilots and creates unforgettable memories every year at Oshkosh.”

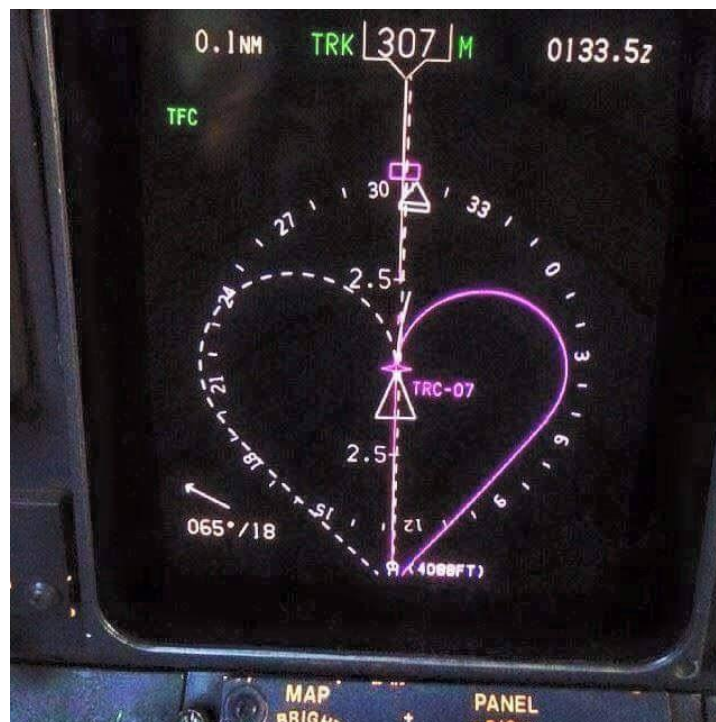
