FAA Launches Advisory Committee to Evaluate Commercial Air Tour Safety

The FAA has established the Commercial Air Tour Aviation Rulemaking Committee (Commercial Air Tour ARC), tasked with reviewing, and developing recommendations to increase the safety of such operations. The Commercial Air Tour ARC is in response to Section 363 of the FAA Reauthorization Act of 2024, which requires the FAA to issue a notice of proposed rulemaking (NPRM) to establish increasing safety regulations for commercial air tour operators.

Commercial air tours include operators conducting non-stop sightseeing flights within a 25–statute mile radius of the departure airport as provided for in 14 CFR 119.1(e)(2). These operations include many flight schools offering non-instructional rides, museums, and small single-aircraft/single-pilot operators at local airports. Congress provided a small business provision that exempts operators conducting 100 or fewer commercial air tours in a calendar year from having to comply with the provision of the NPRM resulting from the ARC recommendations.

The FAA is now soliciting nominations for participation in the Commercial Air Tour ARC. Nominees must either be representatives of industry (including manufacturers of aircraft and aircraft technologies), air tour operators or organizations that represent such operators, or aviation safety experts with specific knowledge of safety management systems and flight data monitoring programs under 14 CFR Part 135.

As a provider of commercial air tours utilizing several types of aircraft, including Ford Tri-Motor rides on national tour, biplane rides at Pioneer Airport, and helicopter rides at AirVenture, EAA will be asking to participate in the ARC. With decades of safe air tour operations, extensive maintenance experience, and a fully implemented safety management system, EAA is poised to provide a real-world perspective to the FAA.

Those looking to nominate potential participants, including self-nominations, must follow the directions published in the [Federal Register notice](#). Nominations must be received by 5 p.m. on February 28, 2025.

FAA Adds Email Delivery Option for Aircraft and Dealer Registration Certificates

The FAA Aircraft Registration Branch has developed and is implementing the ability to electronically issue registration certificates for both aircraft and aircraft dealers. In lieu of physically mailed documents, the FAA will now email copies of aircraft registrations and dealer's registration certificates after applications are made **online**, providing "streamlined and expedited delivery service while also reducing the cost and labor burden of mailing for the Registry," according to their announcement. Owners are still required to carry their registration in the aircraft, and will need to print a copy once received from the FAA. An aircraft owner may still request a traditional paper certificate from the Registry.

In the notice, the FAA emphasizes,

"...the issuance of a registration certificate in electronic form does not, in any way, obviate or affect the need to comply with statutory, regulatory, or other requirements involving aircraft registration or dealer's registration certificates. Notably, in general, a Certificate of Aircraft Registration must still be carried on the aircraft."

With a January 17, 2025, notice in the Federal Register, the FAA announced the immediate adoption of these changes to enable the use of the new Civil Aviation Registry, FAA Aircraft Registry Branch, to utilize the Civil Aviation Registry Electronic Service (CARES) system. CARES is a web-based electronic system that allows applications and supporting documentation to be uploaded securely to the FAA. The system also allows for the use of digital signatures, the payment of fees, and the tracking of applications. According to the FAA, a feature of CARES allows the electronic issuance and delivery of registration certificates, thus avoiding their need to be printed and mailed, a process that generally created a 7-10 business day wait for aircraft owners.

MOU signed for Smith Field hangar to serve as future home of National Airmail Museum

FORT WAYNE, Ind. (WPTA) - The National Airmail Museum's Board of Directors share they have signed a memo of understanding (MOU) with the Fort Wayne Airport Authority (FWAA) toward leasing Smith Field's Hangar No. 2 to serve as the future home of the National Airmail Museum. The organization says its goal in housing the National Airmail Museum at Smith Field's Hangar No. 2 is to educate the public about Fort Wayne's part in the early history of flight. Listed on the National Register of Historic Buildings, Smith Field's Hangar No. 2 was dedicated in 1930 as a stopover for pilots flying the mail cross country in the early days of America's airmail service.

The signing of the MOU with FWAA signals the start of fundraising and construction of the National Airmail Museum, according to the organization.

BasicMed, did you know?

BasicMed which took effect in 2017, allows pilots to fly without holding an FAA medical certificate provided they meet certain conditions. The FAA Reauthorization Act of 2024 required the FAA to expand BasicMed to:

- Increase the number of allowable passengers to six from five, and the number of occupants to seven from six.
- Increase the maximum aircraft takeoff weight to 12,500 lbs. from 6,000 lbs., excluding transport category helicopters
- Allow pilot examiners to conduct flight checks using BasicMed in aircraft that are covered by the BasicMed rule.

Paul has shared these valuable words of wisdom for everyone.

When you reach to twist a knob, move a control, or even just look away to check a chart on your iPad, you're unconsciously nudging the flight controls. It's almost impossible to suppress these involuntary inputs. They're especially insidious when you're in IMC or flying at night, and if you don't catch the deviation quickly, a gentle bank can lead to a spiraling descent or other prelude to a loss of control, especially if you also experience the first symptoms of spatial disorientation.

The key to avoiding subtle control inputs is opening your hand before you turn your attention away from the instruments—or the big horizon outside the window when you're flying visually. Don't completely let go of the yoke or stick. Just consciously relax your fingers and arm so that you don't make roll or pitch inputs while you're performing a cockpit flow check, switching fuel tanks, changing frequencies, or loading an approach.

Pause briefly before you turn your focus away from the primary flight instruments. With repetition, this habit becomes almost as automatic as the involuntary inputs that cause the problem in the first place.

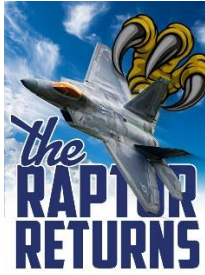

Aviation job helps to ensure aircraft prototypes are in safe condition for flight.

Test pilots have an opportunity like no other. They get to ensure that aircraft prototypes and newly built airframes are safe for further development, test flying, and eventual commercial operation.

Safety pilots also have a significant responsibility. They must put an airplane through a range of maneuvers and operations beyond normally expected and denote any irregularities and problems that must be fixed by engineers and production staff.

Becoming a test pilot often requires special experience and qualifications beyond those required for normal civilian pilots. Test pilots must be at the top of their game and be ready to handle any irregularity that arises in flight. These pilots go through rigorous training in order to do their jobs.
