As you will read in the brief comments below, made by each of our Ray Scholars, they are refining their skills, for both the oral and flight portions of their upcoming check rides. A big shout out to Adam for being persistent and finding creative ways to continue learning about aviation while patiently waiting for the Cessna 172 to be air worthy. We couldn't be prouder of the dedication shown by our Ray Scholars and look forward to celebrating their upcoming successes!

This month has been busy. I went on my first solo flight and cross-country flight. For the short solo flight, I went to Franklin Airfield (F72), University Airport (KEDU) and back to Sacramento executive (KSAC). For my solo cross-country I went to Modesto Airport (KMOD), to Los Banos airport (KLSN) and then back to Executive. My navigation and communication skills have improved significantly since last month. We've been doing study sessions recently every weekend since there are four students including myself that will be taking their check ride next month. checkrides at Nevada County Airport (KGOO) with DPE Carol Zerbe. Wish them luck and let's help them get ready!

We have also successfully booked Matthew Howell a checkride on February 11, 2025! Once he has his government-issued ID, he will be soloing soon. Yay, Matthew!
