#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

First, through the hard work of Stan Lawrence, Kim Owen and Esteban Nava, VAA 25 was awarded a \$10,000 Ray Aviation Scholarship! The scholarship was announced by David Leiting, Jr., an EAA Chapter Field Representative, while he was out here giving the EAA Boot Camp for local Chapter officers in late February. Kim completed and submitted our our application for the Ray Scholarship in early February, and Stan and Esteban invited David and his fellow Boot Camp presenter to dinner after their Boot Camp presentation for a little "schmoozing." Well it works, because David broke the news to us at dinner. A huge shout out to Stan, Kim, and Esteban for their hard work. That means VAA 25 will have \$10K to put toward flight training of one of our Young Eagles.

More good news. We offered the scholarship to one of our Young Eagles, Tyler Pierson, and he accepted. Right now, Kim is holding off requesting the first payment for flight training while we see how long the Governor's shelter in place order remains in place. Hope to get Tyler's flight training started soon. Tyler will also have the opportunity to fly back with us to Oshkosh for the 2020 Fly-in and attend the Air Academy while he's back there. (We also offered another Young Eagle, Audrey Robbins, the opportunity to fly back with us for the fly-in at Oshkosh this summer.) If Nick Leonard goes back, and he always does, you can be sure that he will give these two Young Eagles the opportunity to experience all the delights of Oshkosh, including Culver's Frozen Custard, the Pile of Perch at Wendt's on the Lake at Lake Winnebago, and deep fried cheese curds!

Also, congratulations are in order to Hayden Schaufel who completed his check ride and was awarded his private pilot's license on March 19<sup>th</sup>. (Hayden, the cockpit is not where you are supposed to shelter in place! Just saying.) Hayden has been with the Young Eagles program for the past few years and traveled to Oshkosh with us in 2018. Hayden also continues to come out the hangar on Saturday and putter on airplanes. Hayden is in his first year of college at Sac State and plans to pursue a career in aviation when he finishes his college education. Congratulations, Hayden!

I attended the EAA Boot Camp here in Sac in late February. It was a (tiring) daylong session, but very useful as the presenters gave us attendees a lot of valuable information about building and growing our local chapter. (It's like drinking from a fire hose.) And on the subject of our local chapter, one of the recommendations at the Boot Camp was for each local chapter to have a media spokesperson for inquiries from the media about aviation-related subjects. I will be the contact person for VAA 25, and I've asked Steve Lightstone to assist me. Because of his broad aviation knowledge and experience, I will coordinate any inquiries with him, and let him make the public responses.

I also put him in contact with Esteban to see about coordinating our resources and partnering with them on activities like our Young Eagles flights. We will see how it pans out.

Like all other organizations, we are concerned about the well-being of our members and the Young Eagles whom we work with. Accordingly, we are canceling our April fly-out to Watts-Woodland Airport, and there is a good chance our May fly-out will be canceled as well. We will keep you advised. And while I am on that subject, we have our Young Eagles' flights scheduled for Sunday, May 17<sup>th</sup>, at KSAC. It's too soon to know if it will go ahead as planned, or if we will have to continue it to June.

A huge shout out to Steve for his super work. Unfortunately, we will be canceling our April and May VMC meetings at this time. #### YOUNG EAGLES SACRAMENTO / DGA REPORT

We have continued our Saturday sessions throughout the month of March until this last Saturday. Saturday, March 21, 2020 was a strictly on voluntary basis, two of our Young Eagles opted out. We had one Tech advisor and one flight

instructor in attendance, Nick Leonard & Stan Lawrence respectfully with two Young Eagles 7 Tyler Pierson and Dylan Fricke.

As previously reported by our Secretary Scott; Hayden Schaufel soloed December 15, 2018 and received his Private Pilots Certificate March 19, 2020. He did an AWESOME job flying the Cessna 150/150. The Designated Pilot Examiner was Orin Breedlove. The oral took 2.5 hrs and the flight portion was 1.4 hrs.

Hayden started March 2018 with our Young Eagle & Build, Maintain and Fly weekly Saturday program. Soloed in DGA's Young Eagle & built RV-12 on December 15, 2018. In 2018 we were only training to the Solo. So, Hayden enrolled in CFI's Private Pilots Pilot training program where he again soloed in a Cessna 172M. Where he completed most of his Phase II & III training. He came back to Stan's Flight School and completed Phase VI and Recommendation ride for his Private Pilot Practical Test.

Hayden self-studied with Sporty's free to Young Eagles online FAA written exam for the Private Pilots Certificate course.

Please give a congratulatory virtual high five nin view of the required Social distancing. He is a very deserving young man and a great student! It was a pleasure to be able to help him attain a certificate to learn how to fly. Because this is only the beginning. Unfortunately, I didn't take any picture after his marvelous achievement....my bad!

We also received amazing news, our EAA Vintage Chapter 25 won the Ray Foundation Private Pilot Training Scholarship. We proceeded to evaluate our four Young Eagles in our Saturday program. Esteban Nava, our Chapter Vice President, created a scholarship application for both the EAA Ray Foundation and the Advanced AirVenture AirAcademy Camp. In addition, an all-expenses paid trip to AirVenture one week early for volunteering and enjoyment of the AirVenture Show is provided by DGA pilots who go to Oshkosh to the two recipients. After evaluation of applications and using a scoring rubric created by Esteban, the applications were distributed to eight different judges familiar with our weekly Saturday sessions and the attendees to score each application. So, it is with great pleasure that we announce that Tyler Pierson has won both the Ray

Scholarship and the Advanced AirAcademy Camp. The all-expenses paid light plane flight to AirVenture was won by Audrey Robbins.

Saturday, March 21, 2020 was the official beginning of Tyler's flight training. He put in 1.2 hours of instruction. His application sent to the EAA headquarters was official accepted and he will be given the full Ten Thousand dollars. Today Monday, March 23 it's been reported that the first payment of \$4,000.00 is on the way. It will be sent directly to the Chapters' bank account.

Tyler's birthday is December 5, 2020 he will be 17. We will plan weather permitting, to have him ready for his check ride on that date. As you all may know you must be 17 years of age before you can attain your private license.

We also received good news about the possibility of being able to use the funds for two Eagles toward their private license. However, we must complete the certification of the first candidate to his/her private before we can proceed to the second.

In our evaluations of costs of fuel, oil, a/c maintenance, instructor fee and aircraft rental will be about \$70.00/hr or about \$4,200.00 for 60 hrs of instruction. Of course, this is only possible because of donation of the aircraft which isn't being amortized.

I'd like to thank everyone who has worked so hard on this effort. Especially Kim Owen, Esteban Nava, Nick Leonard, and Mark Zukowski. I feel our weekly Young Eagle Saturday sessions are the catalyst that brings this all together.
