SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

As we glide into the holidays our Ray Scholars continue to use the good-weather days to sharpen their piloting skills and learn new facets of flying. On the days that are a little dreary for flying, they are busy studying for their check-rides. We are anticipating both May and Rachel will be scheduled for their check-rides over the first few months of 2023.

We are also pleased to announce that we have applied for an additional 2 scholars for the 2023 year. We have been fortunate to enjoy many successes from this incredible EAA opportunity.

A few words from our scholars...

November has certainly been exciting so far! I've been working with Stan quite a bit on several types of landings (short field, soft field, and spot) and takeoffs (short field and soft field). The challenge has definitely picked up with the increased winds in these winter months, but practicing in crosswinds has been a great learning experience. A main focus for me has been trying to take control of the airplane rather than letting it control me, which has been an especially important concept in these weather conditions. I also had the opportunity to go along with Stan to the Watsonville flyout in the RV-14! This was my first time flying in the left seat of this plane, and it was definitely a learning curve. I loved how fast it was, and the entirely new environment of the glass cockpit. It took some getting used to, but I look forward to more opportunities to fly in this amazing plane!

Since receiving the Ray Aviation Scholarship on October 8, 2022, things have been very busy (but in a fun way!)

First, I continued my flight training with Stan Lawrence in his Cessna 150/150. We probably did upwards of 50 laps around Franklin Field in preparation of my first solo. My biggest problems were maintaining proper airspeed (keep it at 80!) and keeping my wings level on landing. After lots of practice, I not only learned to prevent these problems but also how to fix them. On October 29, I had my first solo. As I completed my first solo lap, I did not need to do any extra corrections and made a great landing. With excitement and confidence, I completed 3 more landings, proper radio communications and all! Here is a picture of Stan and I once I got out of the airplane.



Once we got back to KSAC, I had my Shirt-Cutting Ceremony to cut my “wings” (which is a giant hole in the back of my shirt). I was greeted by lots of love from all my friends at EAA Vintage Chapter 25.



After my first solo, I completed my essay for the Ray Scholarship Lightspeed Headset and reflected on the things I’ve learned since receiving the scholarship. One of the most positive experiences of being a scholar besides learning to fly has been

spending time with other aviators, being able to learn, celebrate our successes, and fly together.

After a couple of cloudy days, the sky was finally clear enough for me to complete my next solo at KEDU (My school!). Once we arrived at the airport, there was a slight tailwind on runway 17, so we switched to a left pattern on runway 35. The tricky part about this pattern was turning to crosswind sooner than normal to avoid the residential area. We practiced this new pattern 2 times then it was time for my solo. My first landing was a little rough, but the next 3 went very well and I felt very confident. Now, it's time for a solo at L36!



A huge thanks to all scholarship coordinators and contributors for making this opportunity possible. It is truly changing lives.
