Well, our Ray Scholars are keeping our CFIs very busy. We now have 3 Ray Scholars actively pursuing their PPLs along with training another chapter's student. Please be sure to take some time to encourage our pilots-in-training and maybe share a hangar story or two with them. For those that can remember, the early days of learning to fly can be daunting, frustrating and exciting. Here are a few words from our Ray Scholars...

My flight training is mostly on the ground vs in the air. I'm currently taking a class in Sacramento City College, and I just passed its final! (The class is 4 weeks long, and I'm taking 4 aviation classes back-to-back, and I just finished my first class, and my next class starts tomorrow.) I also heard the Cessna 172 is coming out of maintenance soon. I'm excited to start flying in the 172 again!

School has started in the last month, so it's been busy, but I've made some progress. First, I completed the flight simulator. I finished the last ten of the twenty scenarios in the training for the beta test. The simulator scenarios covered things like: minimum airspeed, unusual attitudes, and turns around a point.

Additionally, I had my first official flight lesson. Tenley and I flew the Cessna 150 and went over the four fundamentals, slow flight, power off stalls, and takeoffs and landings. Although there are some very clear differences between the simulator and real life, I did feel that it helped prepare me for what to expect. My plan is to

continue working with the simulator as I continue with flight training.


A SUCCESSFUL BEER AND BRATS FUNDRAISER!


