Even though the County gave away our room reservation without telling us, Stan and the Aviator restaurant staff scrambled, and we had our meeting and breakfast, albeit a little more crowded than we wanted it to be. Despite the snafu, it was a roaring, and noisy, success.

And let me also give a special shout-out to Red Hamilton and his lovely wife, Marylin Boese, who drive down every year for the meeting and breakfast. Red and Marylin are based out of Little River Airport in Mendocino County (KLLR) and are two of the founding members of VAA 25. We are talking about a small group of aviators who started the Chapter in 1993 and look at how it has grown and prospered since then. But more about that later. As Red said at the Breakfast, he was motivated by EAA's Young Eagles Program, and at last count has flown over 850 Young Eagles. That's a lot of kids he has introduced to aviation. Not only was Breakfast a success, the members present also confirmed the Chapter's officers for 2025. And in addition to these officers, let me also give a shout-out to Earl Johnson, who sits with future aviators every week teaching them the nuances of flight on our multi-screen simulator, as well as Kyle Rodriguez, who acted as our Events Coordinator for our "Beer and Brats" fundraiser last year. Kyle, together with Tyler Pierson, will be applying for certification as Technical Counselors in 2025. Strong work fellows. And speaking of the future, think about how you would like to help this year.

Now, back to our successes and accomplishments this past year. We increased our membership last year to 54 members and have a vibrant and supportive group of members and volunteers. We were awarded Silver Chapter status last year (shooting for Gold this year) and were a featured Chapter in the EAA *Sport Aviation* magazine as well. Not bad. And a gentle request to all our members. Our Chapter gets points toward Gold status when 20% of our members complete the Annual Chapter Member survey, which only takes a few minutes. So, when the survey is available, I will mention it in the Newsletter (as I did in the December Newsletter) and include a link to it and ask that you do the Chapter a "solid" by taking the time to complete it. Thanks.

And now on to flying, since we are an Aviation Chapter. Led by our V.P., CFII instructor pilot, and Eagle Flight Leader Tenley Ong, we had fly-outs last year to Oceania and Alta Sierra, and also participated in the fall Poker Run out of Lincoln Airport. And if that's not enough, VAA 25 hosted, with help from Chapter 52, both the Spring and Fall Young Eagle Rally out at Yolo Airport. That's a lot of flying! Last year, the Young Eagle Rallies alone flew well over 160 kids. A special thank you to all the pilots and volunteers who donated their time, flying ability and efforts to support and fly these Young Eagles. We could not have done it without our many pilots, volunteers, and supporters.

In addition to all this local flying, Stan, Tenley, Tyler, and Kyle took 4 planes, including one owned by Bill La Grassa (thank you Bill) cross country to EAA AirVenture Oshkosh with 4 Young Eagles for their first taste of this airshow extravaganza. And the plane flown by Kyle was a C-150! That's a lot of low and slow, or slightly higher and slow flying!

And VAA 25 had its fair share of social and training events too, including the Spring BBQ at the south hangars and our Fall Beer and Brats fundraiser at the VAA 25 hangar, both of which were well attended. As for flight training, our Chapter successfully "landed" 2 Ray Scholarship last year, which are being used to train two Young Eagles for their private's license. And in addition to flight training, Earl "the stick" Johnson provided weekly simulator training to future aviators as part of our weekly Build and Maintain Program at the VAA 25 hangar, and these Young Eagles there were also taught the basics of aircraft maintenance and repair during these Saturday sessions. And a serious shout out at this time to Angelina Angrisani, a newly minted CFII, Rachel Long, a former Ray Scholar and private pilot, Tyler Pierson, newly minted instrument and commercial pilot (and soon to be CFI), and Kyle Rodriguez, another private pilot, who were frequently at the hangar mentoring and supporting these future aviators. And finally, a big shout out to Steve "Mr. F-18" Lightstone for heading up our VMC Club and all the timely safety training.

So, what's on the schedule for 2025? For Tyler, it's completing his CFI as he advances his flying career. We also hope to see the addition of 2 new Technical Counselors to the ranks of VAA 25 in the person of Tyler and Kyle. And of course, we plan to continue our fly-outs this year as well as our annual trip to Oshkosh, and, of course, our weekly Build and Maintain Program at the hangar and monthly VMC Club meetings. Also on our radar for 2025 are two more Ray Scholarships. Based on our track record, we have a high confidence of being awarded them and in turn helping two more Young Eagles join the ranks of private pilots. That's a lot on our plate for this year.

So that is the plan for 2025. And as we start the New Year off, we invite all our members to volunteer their time to support these worthwhile projects, especially the Spring and Fall Young Eagle Rallies, and to come out for our monthly VMC meetings at the airport. Just a reminder, things kick off with our first VMC Club meeting on Saturday, January 18<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. in the airport terminal meeting room. Remember, safety in flying comes from experience and knowledge.
