YOUNG EAGLES SACRAMENTO / DGA REPORT

Young Eagle Report Valley:

It's the end of September and the virus shutdown is still going strong. So, it appears that there won't be any Young Eagle **%** Rallies this year! Very unfortunate as with many things of 2020.

Our Young Eagle Build, Maintain, and Fly program is going strong and we are so blessed that we have been able to do it safely to date. We have five boys faithfully attending our Saturday sessions. Every Saturday, they spend from 9:00am through 3:00pm. They do some building: example helping with a glass panel installation being installed in Kim Owens RV-6A, N811WT. They do some maintenance; example oil change and firewall forward inspection of our training aircraft Cessna 150/150 N3062S, which included the repair of a broken airbox support bracket. They do some flying; example Dylan Fricke flew 1.2 hours last Saturday 9/19/20 and has 13.0hrs of instruction. Liam Robinson flew 1.1hrs and a total of 10 hrs of instruction. Tyler Stump flew 1.0hrs and has 5.0hrs of instruction. Hayden Schaufel is our senior Young Eagle 7, he has his Private Pilots Certificate soloing in the RV-12 and doing his check ride in N3062S. He helps all the Young Eagles during our Saturday sessions as a mentor. He's indispensable to our program.

Tyler Pierson, our Ray Scholar has essentially completed his training for his Private and is waiting to become a 17-year-old (December 5, 2020). In the meantime, he is staying sharp with solo fights practicing stalls, slow flight, steep turns and takeoff and landing at local airports.

The Ray Scholarship Foundation allows use to use the excess money in our scholarship to train a second Young Eagle assuming we cover anything in excess of the Original \$10,000 scholarship fund. Since we have spent less than ½ the total we are confident we will be able to award a second Ray Scholarship fund. The second Ray Scholarship must receive his Private by March 2021. That being

said, I'm going to have Kim Owen our Ray Scholarship Foundation Coordinator elaborate.

Back to the whole networking thing I was able to meet and fly with Rick Atkins, the owner of Ragtime Aero. (His daughter Desiree is friends with my mom named Desiree also. Small world.) We first started a tour with his company hangar where he showed us his current project, the first ever Luscombe Phantom ever created back in 1934. Afterwards I was able to go up flying with him in a tail-dragger Cessna and despite me only flying in one once, I was able to pull off a fairly smooth landing. Pretty fun flight, and it was nice to meet another pilot in the community.
