We recently restructured EAA's headquarters staff, with an overall goal of providing the EAA Membership with improved service in core areas such as Publications, Websites, Chapters, Aviation Services and Government Relations.

The reason for this letter is to let you know that we are also planning to make special efforts to improve the value provided to EAA's membership in Canada.

As you may already have noticed, we worked hard to make sure that Canada was fully served by the new EAA online Calendar of Events (<u>www.eaacalendar.org</u>). This included entering information for over 800 Canadian airports into our database by hand, so the calendar could automatically generate maps and basic flight planning data. Hopefully the calendar will prove to be a useful resource to the aviation community in the months and years ahead.

Our next step will come in May 2008, when we plan to launch a brand new electronic newsletter designed exclusively for EAA members in Canada. Edited by Jack Dueck of EAA Chapter 1410 in High River, Alberta, the newsletter will be delivered by email each month to all EAA members in Canada, and will feature news, events, features and activities from across the country. Past newsletters will be archived on the web.

Jack will be working closely with EAA Headquarters staff to produce the newsletter, which we hope will become a valuable resource for the Canadian EAA community. If you have any story ideas or suggestions for Jack he would be delighted to hear from you via email at <u>jdueck@eaa.org</u>.

Finally for now, we are also looking ahead to the next year and ways that EAA can support celebrations of the 100th anniversary of powered flight in Canada. One idea that has already come up is to make the anniversary a theme of AirVenture 2009, with special displays and activities.

EXHAUST - from the Carb Heat Archives

The May 1988 meeting of EAA Chapter 245 was held at the Carp Hangar.

Thirty-eight members and fourteen guests attended. Of interest to new members, it was noted, is the various types of material used in building light homebuilt aircraft – wood, steel tube, sheet aluminum and composites. Club representatives spoke about working with each of these types, addressing four basic questions – why did you decide on the type of construction you chose? – how have you found working with it? – have you encountered any particular problem with this type of construction? – if starting a new project would you go this route again?.

Improvements were being made to the facilities including digging a well and locating a

water pump and pressure tank. "Now if we can only join them all together into a working pressure system" wrote President Doug Richardson. A stairwell was being built to the storage loft in the hangar and the purchasing and installation of drywall was planned for the summer of 1988.
