"Command Decisions" by Retired Major General Gordon Duquemin

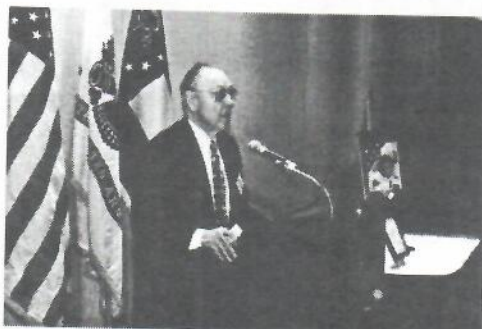
EAA Chapter 690 will present a program entitled "Command Decisions" by Retired Major General Gordon Duquemin on Friday, July 13, 2007 at the EAA 690 hangar at the Gwinnett County Airport in Lawrenceville, GA. General Duquemin will discuss decisions made by Generals during World War II. This will include mistakes made by Generals in both the European and Pacific theaters of war. And yes, he will also include one of the mistakes he made while in the service. This should be a very interesting program on the military commanders during the war.

General Duquemin was born in Milwaukee, Wisconsin and attended the University of Wisconsin, Madison, for two years. He then graduated

from the United States Military Academy, West Point, New York, in June 1947 with a BS in Military Science. He served in the United States Army for over 34 years, retiring at Fort McPherson, June 1981 as a Major General.

In combat, he commanded a Platoon, a Company, a Battalion, and a Brigade. He participated in the Korean Conflict 1950-51 (1 year); and Vietnam War, (32 months). He commanded the V Infantry Division, "THE BIG RED ONE", at Fort Riley,

Kansas. He attended the Naval War College and has a Masters Degree in International Relations. He was Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations, for both FORCES Command Headquarters at Fort McPherson, and U.S. Army Forces Europe. He has lived in or visited over 35 different countries of the world.



After retirement from the United States Army, he went to Saudi Arabia for three years to train the Saudi Arabian National Guard; the forces that protect the Royal Family and provide internal security for Saudi Arabia.

During his service to our country he received numerous decorations and awards.

General Duquemin married Patricia Jones in 1949. They have three children, and 9 grandchildren.

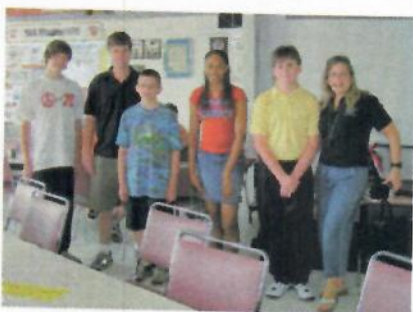

Item 13. DEBI HUFFMAN WOULD LIKE TO BRING HER CLASS TO WORK ON THE MONERAI SAILPLANE IN THE CHAPTER HANGAR – The Monerai Sailplane is stored in and about the Chapter Hangar. Work is suspended during ROBOTICS competition season, and will resume in January of 2008.

Chapter 690 members who worked on the New Standard project were recognized at our annual Holiday Banquet.

Several skilled craftsmen from Peachstate Aerodrome have worked to repair the damaged D25 New Standard owned by Old Rhinebeck Aerodrome located in Rhinebeck, New York. This beautiful airplane was involved in an accident about 4 years ago and it flew again for the first time earlier this month.

Ron & Regina Alexander and Bill and Charlotte Hammond graciously hosted some of the 690 volunteers at a cookout. Flights in the bi-plane made it a perfect day.

The New Standard was built in 1928 specifically for barnstorming. The beautifully restored airplane will be flown to Rhinebeck later this summer and placed into service hopping rides.

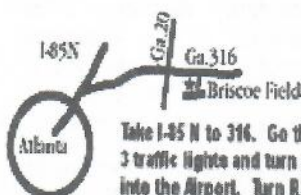
