Am I going to get the booster vaccine when it is available? You bet!





Charlie Churchman, Joe Armas: Building a RANS-6

Charlie has been in the EAA for fifty years, and soloed in 1970. He's been a past president of Chapter 1415 (now inactive).

He has about 1600 hours of single engine, VFR flying, and puts on 30-75 hours a year. He's a retired chemical engineer, a Fellow in the American Institute of Chemical Engineers, and used to design chemical plants. He still has his PE license in four states, including Georgia. He's owned a Cherokee 140 and a Piper Dakota, where he got most of his hours.

In 2014, Charlie did a talk at 690 on his Jefferson Gyrodyne, which he has two patents on, for a VTOL aircraft. It is still in progress at a hangar out at the Jackson County airport, where the RANS S6; he'll be talking about at the September Pancake Breakfast, is based. He also builds a variety of RC aircraft of unusual designs, a few of which have actually flown!

The RANS S6 Charlie will be talking about was built over about a six-year period by a team of six people, mostly drinking coffee on Saturday mornings while they pulled a rivet or two. Only two of the original builders are still active with the project Charlie and Joe. The plane first flew in 2014, and now has about 200 hours on it. This past April, Charlie and his wife Alsie flew the RANS down to Key West and back, uneventfully, if a tad slowly. Charlie's partner, Joe Armao, just finished flying the RANS to Oshkosh and back, and camped out in the Homebuilt area in his one-man tent! He's planning on taking his son along with him next year!

Now is the time for you to become more engaged with EAA 690 by volunteering for one of these positions.







Two small LED lights, with blue light showing, were placed on the trailing edges of the wing to illuminate the engine nacelles and the surrounding area. My car headlights illuminated the left side of the nose, and the tug's LED light illuminated the right side of the nose. The exposure was 4 seconds at F8, ISO 160, at 51 mm on a Canon 24-70 F2.8L ISM lens, on a tripod-mounted Canon 5D MKIV body.





Scheduled Time Of Arrival (STA)

A STA is the desired time that an aircraft should cross a certain point (landing or metering fix). It takes other traffic and airspace configuration into account. A STA time shows the results of the TBFM scheduler that has calculated an arrival time according to parameters such as optimized spacing, aircraft performance, and weather.
