Take Note

The failure of an improperly installed nicopress sleeve on a control cable is believed to be the cause of an accident near Milwaukee. This particular accident involved an ultralight, but it could have happened to any air vehicle using cable and swedging.

It is imperative that each swedge of every nicopress sleeve or fitting be checked with a GO-NO-GO gauge or micrometer. (See Sport Aviation, July 1980, pages 13 and 14 for a "gripping" story about installing cables.)



One Scale

Save two-thirds of your money. Why use three scales when one will do the job. Reactions are a definite numerical value whether they are measured separately or simultaneously. Of course, this is true only if the conditions remain the same. When determining the reactions at one wheel at a time, the attitude of the aircraft must be exactly the same for each weighing. Once each reaction has been determined, proceed with the weight and balance calculations as usual. (from Kenneth Woodard, EAA #9252, of Millis, Mass)
