### Local (Carp) OAS Flight training

Ottawa Aviation Services (OAS) is opening a Satellite operation at the Carp Airport beginning the first weekend in April, operating initially 4 days per week: Thursday through to Sunday. The operation will be located at the 'Roots Hanger' using the office in the hanger to provide both instruction, and administration.

We will be operating two aircraft initially: a Diamond Katana DA-20A1 and a Cessna C-172M. The Katana will be available on Friday and Saturday while the Cessna will be available on Thursday and Sunday. Unfortunately, the Cessna has a previous engagement this Thursday April 2, but will be available Sunday April 5 and is reserved for Carp on Thursdays and Sundays going forward.

As you start flying at Carp, you will be asked to start a file with OAS. We will have the files on hand at CARP and will assist you in completing the forms. 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It was a clear cold morning, Friday the 13<sup>th</sup> of March to be exact, and finally it seemed the planets were aligned for the delivery of Bill Argue's pride and joy Pegazair to its new owner in Rimouski.

Bill had made the deal last December and, though the new owner was keen to have the plane home for Christmas, he was not able to take it with him because he had no tail-dragger experience. I agreed to make the delivery (always glad to fly when somebody else is buying the gas) but was unsure of when it would happen because:

- 1. It had to be good weather all the way;
- 2. I had to be able to get off work; and

3. The temperature had to be no colder than -10C.

The third requirement is because one of the design features of Bill's airplane is no cabin

heat!

We were definitely violating rule #3 that Friday morning at -17C but the forecast looked so good that it was obviously the day to go. Bills strip had been muddy but a couple of days of frigid temperatures had taken care of that.

Bill's wife Kathleen donated a hair dryer to the cause. Thanks to the "Hair-Dryer-Herman-Nelson" the engine of C-GFFD was toasty warm and fired up without hesitation, despite the

This was my first time ever in a plane with skis so even though I was planning all operations from more or less bare & dry strips, I was mildly curious about the effect the skis would have on the ground handling and flying trim of the aircraft. "Don't worry about it" everyone said, and they where right. As I lifted off from **Diamondview International, the** plane performed and handled exactly as usual. It was a westbound takeoff into the wind which would speed me all the way to Rimouski. A 180 after departure for a final flypast for the Argues and I was on my way.

The boys at Quebec FIC were justifiably optimistic about the weather for the flight. The only possible snag was the chance of moderate low level turbulence due to the strong west wind. One thing was sure: it would be a fast ride with 20 to 25 knot tailwinds all the way. I had planned the trip with stops at Trois-Rivières and Rivière-du-Loup. The first leg over the Laurentians was a piece of cake. I was a bit concerned about the cold in a plane with no cabin heat, but the late-winter sun beating down through that skylight and my trusty parka kept me comfortable all the way. My water bottle on the seat beside me however froze solid!

It seemed like no time before the ski hills of the Laurentians were left behind, the broad St Lawrence valley spread out before me and Trois-Rivières Unicom came to life. **Bill's** plane has an altimeter with a millibar sub-scale and somehow track of the had lost Ι conversion chart, so while I did fly a circuit, I can't guarantee it was at circuit altitude. My first landing on wheel-skis was uneventful.

On the ground at Trois-Rivières I was pleasantly welcomed by all concerned. I got the Pegazair filled up with the 42 litres of gas we had burned between Carp and there and went into their very comfortable airport restaurant for some good Quebecois pea soup.

Now, Bill had told me that First Air was doing maintenance there and I had seen their 727 and a Hawker 748 aircraft there when I landed. Turns out, Bill's son Fred (First Air Flight Engineer) was there that same day but unfortunately, we didn't cross paths.

After takeoff from Trois-Rivières I headed across the river to follow the south shore eastbound. I was surprised to see freight boats plying the river. I didn't know they kept it open all winter this far inland.

A direct route would take me right over Quebec City. My next challenge was to see how close to Quebec City I could get without a transponder. According to my calculations I could skirt the 7 nm control zone just under 1400 ASL and be legal. The controllers were friendly and helpful, so I guess I was OK.

Cruising down the river I just had to take a picture of the GPS which was reading 108 kts.

Those of you who know the Pegazair will understand when I say that's the first time I've seen anything close to that groundspeed in that airplane. The beautiful St. Lawrence farmland was slipping by so fast I decided to skip the stop at Rivière-du-Loup and in no time Rimouski was in sight. The folks at Mont-Joli FSS (12 miles to the east) provide the airport advisory for Rimouski.

The surface wind was still gusting over 20 kts, but was right down Runway 25. As I touched down, I noticed the big door on the huge military hanger slowly opening. I taxied in and a group of about 8 happy people came out to greet me, including GFFD's new owner, Gérard Morneau. Two of them steadied the wings against the wind and walked me right into the big hanger.

They treated me like royalty in Rimouski that day, but Bill Argue was the real hero. The more they looked at GFFD, the more they praised Bill for his skill and workmanship in the building of that Pegazair. Bill's plane has found a good home.

The border is getting to be a pain with the added requirement to electronically report your manifest both before entering AND before leaving the USA. This will become Mandatory in mid-May this year. You can register via the Internet with the US border folks and keep some information on file so you don't have to enter it more than once. The website at which you register is https://eapis.cbp.dhs.gov/. For the actual rules check at http://edocket.access.gpo.gov/200

8/E8-26621.htm. Also, you could contact John Quarterman, formerly of COPA, who has stayed on top of the cross boarder requirements even after leaving COPA. John is at johnqpublic@rogers.com. I suspect he is the best informed Canadian on US requirements. John wrote about the new manifest requirement in COPA Flight and the story is at http://www.copanational.org/nonmembers/body\_files/Electronic% 20Manifest%20Eng.htm. Last night Al Hepburn did a great job on the topic from a practical point of view, while ignoring the details. He used the system in January flying to Saranac Lake and found that the US border folks have limited understanding of their own process, at least at that time. It was voluntary in January, but will be mandatory in May.
