With the July 24th start of the annual pilgrimage to **Oshkosh** for the annual **Air Venture Convention** a mere three weeks away, I know many members are making plans to either drive or fly there. Our upcoming July 15th meeting is a chance to coordinate plans with other members. For any members who are planning to fly, be sure to obtain the current NOTAM (available via the web at http://www.airventure.org/2006/flying/index.html). I have an old video tape depicting the arrival procedures that have remained largely unchanged for anyone wanting to borrow it. The NOTAM and the EAA web site provide the authoritative information (http://www.airventure.org/atc/index.html provides an excellent visual illustrated guide to the arrival procedures).

Oshkosh Air Venture Tips:

An excellent meeting place is at the Homebuilder's Centre on the flight line north of the tower. Some of our members like to gather there around 4:30 PM to plan dinner arrangements. A favourite when there isn't a special event is the University BlackHawk Common cafeteria which features an all you can eat buffet with excellent salad bar, multiple main course choices, great dessert bar including ice cream for about \$11 (round trip bus fare is \$2).

Two events worth attending are the Homebuilder's dinner at the Nature Centre (tickets available at the Homebuilder's Centre) for a modest fee, and a free event for international visitors simply for registering at the International visitor's tent. 
