Thankfully Dwayne Price and Charlie Martel stepped up to the plate and moved their presentation to accommodate the change but alas last months you were stuck with me talking about propeller attachment. It looks like Transport Canada has avoided confrontation regarding this private aerodromes issue and on February 26th 2015 there was a "NOTICE OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT (NPA): RESPONSIBLE AERODROME DEVELOPMENT" which can be found by Googling the capitalised statement above. I have not reviewed the document fully but it does not look good for those wishing to build "farm strips". I keep harping back to this but we still do not have a Young Eagles Coordinator. The job is not difficult but you do need to keep on the ball to prevent important things from slipping through the cracks. Ameet Nidmarty is working to support the airport in making an EAA Young Eagles event at the FBO but this should really be a Chapter activity. I know the pilots enjoy taking the kids up and there is always good support from the members but we do need to have someone take charge and deal with EAA in Wisconsin and make sure all the necessary paperwork is done before the event.

Sunday morning Coffee and doughnuts is being well frequented and I've seen a few new faces in the chapter lounge. I hope these new faces become regular faces and join the chapter as we need new blood. If you've joined the chapter then welcome and please continue to come. Thanks to those members who come early and set the fire ablaze and make the lounge warm and toasty by the time I arrive.

Last month I talked about the chapter weighing scales and that one of the scales gave erroneous results depending on where the load was placed on the platen. We have discovered the problem lay with the way the battery had been secured. There was an offending tie wrap which was being crushed as the weight was applied. We have since fixed the problem but the onus is on the user to confirm accuracy of the scales prior to usage. This can be done by testing each of the scales using the calibration weight found in the chapter workshop. With a new season of flying coming shortly I envisage there will be several aircraft undergoing annual inspection. I encourage all of you to make a weight & balance part of your annual inspection.

30 YEARS AGO March 1985

At the March 15th, 1985 meeting of EAA Chapter 245, held at 100 Sussex Drive, Gord Standing gave a breakdown of our financial situation:

- ★ Our net worth was \$2,929.34.
- ★ Taxes that year were \$435 (assessment had gone up to \$27,350 from \$20,150 but a lower mill rate resulted in a slight reduction in taxes).
- ★ Our share of airport costs was \$674.
- ★ Insurance was \$400 per year
- ★ Annual cost of the newsletter was approximately \$500.
- ★ The next major outlay was to be for a hangar door estimated to be \$1.000.
- ★ Paid up membership was 35, being down from 51 at that time the previous year.
- ★ Dick Moore placed an initial order of twelve short-sleeved golf shirts with the chapter crest and were priced to sell for \$16.00.

20 YEARS AGO, March 1995

The March 16th, 1995 meeting was Video Night at the Aviation Museum. Several interesting videos were contributed by our members.

Everyone enjoyed the trials and tribulations of Bill Lishman as chronicled in his C'mon Geese video and was said to bring new meaning to the term low & slow.

The Pegasair video also featured low and slow capability thanks to the automatic leading edge slats.

Bill Argue was well already on his way with his Pegasair project.

The Pelican Club was yet another successful Canadian design from our prolific Quebecois designers.


George Elliott helped narrate the Cyclone Video as he was building a C-180 version of the updated clone of the popular Cessna designs.
