

EAA 113 has participated in the Young Eagle program since it is was launched 30 years ago and has flown over 4,000 youth to date! This program has proven to have a positive impact on the future generation of aviators, including many of our very own Young Eagles. It is a true joy knowing so many of our volunteer pilots have made a difference in the lives of these young people.

We have two events scheduled for this Spring and will have two more in the Fall. We need VOLUNTEERS! We simply cannot do these worthwhile events without plenty of help. We need pilots who can commit to the event and lots of help on the ground to assist with registration, loading and escorting youth, safety guards, public relations and tour guides. Please consider coming to help to pass along your enthusiasm for aviation. The joy on the faces of these young people is a powerful reward! There will be a mandatory Safety Briefing held promptly at 8:00 a.m. the morning of the events for all volunteers.

YOUTH PROTECTION TRAINING

ALL pilots MUST take this training and go through a Background Check prior to giving any Young Eagle flights. Anyone assisting with the Youth Workshops and preferably anyone performing ground support duties at Young Eagles are also requested to take this training. It can be found at the <u>www.eaa.org</u> website by logging into your account. Under your profile account is a Training Information Tab. This training takes about 15-20 minutes and passing a short quiz. You will get your completion card a few days later, so be sure to do this promptly if you are not current. You must renew this every three years.

RISK MANAGEMENT TRAINING

This is new training that EAA is requiring of all Coordinators and Chapter leaders. They are also requesting that all Young Eagle pilots take this training. It explains the insurance requirements and what can or cannot be done during Young Eagle events and flights. This training can be found in the same location stated above and again, takes about 20 minutes. Immediately following the quiz you will receive a certificate card. Please send notice of your completion to Debbie, as soon as possible.


The Air Force base says the 88th Civil Engineer Group, first responders, and base safety personnel are assessing damage throughout the base.

"Our initial assessment from this morning's storm is the damage is isolated to the southern side of Area B. Our initial focus right now is on safety and damage assessment," said Col. Travis Pond, 88th Air Base Wing and installation commander. "I can't speak highly enough about our security forces, Fire Department and civil engineer Airmen for their quick response and hard work to assess damage and determine a path forward for restoring operations as quickly as possible."


helped bring Nazi Germany to its knees. These stories of heroism and sacrifice are currently streaming on Apple TV+.

Screen capture as Kay gets ready to "hit the sky" on a flight home to TX in N7738N, Lil Red.


RFDS on PBS, Prime or Apple TV

Also for your viewing consideration is "RFDS, Royal Flying Doctor Service." It is available on PBS Passport (\$5/month, \$60/year), Amazon Prime or Apple TV. Based on the real thing, it is a medical drama (for mature audiences) about doctors, flight nurses and pilots using Super King Airs to service patients in the Australian Outback. The King Airs are often landing on unimproved airstrips, some little more than a one-lane dirt road. I found out online that the actual RFDS also flies Pilatus PC-12s and jets. After all, the Australian Outback is pretty big. But the King Airs are probably cheaper to operate for the show shots and can certainly get into shorter strips. I'm not sure how accurate the flying is, but hey, it's a show with airplanes in every episode! My fiancée and I are hooked, and sometimes watch a couple of episodes a night. But we don't want the series to end too quickly either. We are halfway through the eight-episode second season, but apparently the show has been renewed for a third.




Right: Season two cast in front of one of their trusty King Airs.
