Our first Young Eagle event will be held on **Saturday, April 15th**, **2023** from 8:30-11:30 a.m. We are in need of several volunteers to help with this event....both for Pilots and various Ground Support roles. We need to know if you are able to assist as soon as possible, so we can plan on the number of youth that can actually attend. The event is already at a capacity of 50 but without the support, we will not be able to handle even this many youth.



Please consider coming to help to pass along your enthusiasm for aviation. The joy on the faces of these young people is a powerful reward! There will be a mandatory Safety Briefing held promptly at 8:00 a.m. for all volunteers.

If you are interested in becoming a new Young Eagle pilot, please contact Debbie for specific requirements on your aircraft insurance. EAA has established the following training for volunteers. These training courses are offered to assist in protecting you and the Chapter.

YOUTH PROTECTION TRAINING

ALL pilots MUST take this training and go through a Background Check prior to giving any Young Eagle flights. Anyone assisting with the Youth Workshops and preferably anyone performing ground support duties at Young Eagles are also requested to take this training. It can be found at the www.eaa.org website by logging into your account. Under your profile account is a Training Information Tab. This training takes about 15-20 minutes and passing a short quiz. You will get your completion card a few days later, so be sure to do this promptly if you are not current. You must renew this every three years.

RISK MANAGEMENT TRAINING

This is new training that EAA is requiring of all Coordinators and Chapter leaders. They are also requesting that all Young Eagle pilots take this training. It explains the insurance requirements and what can or cannot be done during Young Eagle events and flights. This training can be found in the same location stated above and again, takes about 20 minutes. Immediately following the quiz you will receive a certificate card. Please send notice of your completion to Debbie, as soon as possible.

EAA 113 past member Tony England has been nominated for induction in the Michigan Aviation Hall of Fame, housed at the Air Zoo, Kalamazoo, MI. Here is his nomination bio. Well done Tony!

Anthony "Tony" England – Astronaut:

Anthony "Tony" England was born in 1942 in Indianapolis, IN. After graduating high school in North Dakota, he received his BS and MS degrees in Geology and a doctorate in Geophysics from MIT. England was selected as a scientist-astronaut by NASA in 1967. Following 53 weeks of training, he served as support crewman for Apollo 13 and 16. He left NASA to join the U.S. Geological Survey in 1972. England returned to NASA in 1979 and was assigned to STS-51F Spacelab-2. The mission carried 13 major experiments. After leaving NASA a second time, England became the dean of the College of Engineering and Computer Science and professor of electrical engineering and computer science at the University of Michigan. England received the Harold R. Johnson Diversity Service award in 2002 and the NCID Exemplary Diversity Engagement and Scholarship in 2009. He retired to northwestern Michigan, where he owns an airplane and water craft.

FIRE DAMAGES HISTORIC WRIGHT COMPANY FACTORY

The historic Wright Company airplane factory in Dayton, Ohio, was significantly damaged in a fire that began early Sunday morning. The factory, which is currently managed by the National Aviation Heritage Area, was built in 1910-1911 and had "significant original building features from the time of the Wright Brothers, including the wood roof and support structure." The cause of the fire and the full extent of the damage is not yet known.

"We are deeply saddened by the fire that damaged our historic Wright Company airplane factory, the first purpose built buildings for the aviation industry," said National Aviation Heritage Area executive director Mackensie Wittmer. "We are grateful to the fire department for their quick and brave response, and we are working to assess the extent of the damage and the impact on our heritage."

According to officials, the fire was called in at 2:28 a.m. local time and no injuries have been reported. The National Aviation Heritage Area stated that it was holding a meeting on Monday to create an emergency action plan. The Dayton Fire Department Fire Investigations Unit is looking into the incident.

Known as the oldest aircraft manufacturing facility in the world, the Wright Company airplane factory produced approximately 120 aircraft before being sold by Orville Wright in 1915. Purchased by the City of Dayton in 2018, it was officially listed on the National Register of Historic Places in September 2019. Preservation and restoration work have been underway since.
