


### WE HAVE ANOTHER TOP GUN PRIVATE PILOT!







On January 15, I updated my Garmin databases. Since the previous flight indicated a high idle condition, I removed the cowling, adjusted the idle screw, reassembled the cowling and did short hops to New Hudson (Y47) and Brighton (45G) before returning to Pontiac. The video is long and the description and comments include the usual disclaimers. It was fun having a Cherokee land at New Hudson in close proximity as I was taxiing back to take off. The idle

still required further adjustment.




A few days later I pulled the cowling again, did another adjustment and did a taxi test with the cowling off. Once again the idle just wasn't coming down. I returned to the hangar and made additional adjustments to the idle screw as well as the cable linkage at the fuel servo. One more test confirmed some success, so the airplane was buttoned back up and put away.





I'd been doing some planning for the cross-country flights I have planned for the summer and I wanted to do one more test flight to confirm performance parameters and for filing ICAO flight plans. I thought it might be fun change of pace to acquire the data before heading off toward the sunset, talking to the video camera about my plans, concerns, and various interpretations of the meaning of life. The weather wasn't cooperating with my plans and the creative itch wouldn't go away, so I ended up making a rather weird video that included situations, conditions, intentions, musings, mutterings, ramblings, soul-barings, workings, strugglings and foamings. In other words, just another goatflieg video. Let's just say I'm glad that my own self-respect does not depend on the opinions of others, but I'm always willing to learn from their wisdom (if it can be verified). 

The annual Winter Flight Fest returns Feb. 11, 2023, at the Experimental Aircraft Association Museum in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, including the popular Skiplane Fly-In.

Activities included with regular museum admission that day:

- \* Wright Flyer simulator: Take the controls of the first powered airplane at Kitty Hawk.
- \* Paper airplane launcher: Fold your best creation and see how it flies.
- \* X-Planes: Create your own X-Plane and test it through various obstacles.
- \* A Pararescue challenge where kids design a miniature parachute and test it in a wind tunnel.
- \* Indoor model airplane flying: Discover what it takes to build and fly a radio-control model.
- \* Clothespin airplanes: Make your own airplane refrigerator magnet.
- \* Airplane model building contest: Open to all ages with no entry fee, with divisions for adults and youth. Contestants can build their models prior to Feb. 11 but must have their models registered by 1 p.m. Judging begins at 2 p.m., with winners announced immediately afterward.

### **Skiplane Fly-In**

Pilots will land on the snow-covered airstrip at Pioneer Airport throughout the day. Shuttles will operate from the museum to Pioneer Airport throughout the day.

As part of the Skiplane Fly-In tradition, enjoy free chili at Pioneer Airport.
