
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On The Cover:



The Wright Flyer and The Apollo 11 Moon Walk

Did you know that there was a connection between the Wright Brothers Flyer and the Apollo 11 Moon Walk? The Wright Brothers grew up in Ohio, as did Neil Armstrong, the first man to walk on the moon. The Wrights and Armstrong had similar aspirations to fly one day. Through an arrangement with the U.S. Air Force Museum in Dayton, Ohio, Armstrong was asked to take remnants of the fabric that covered the wings and a piece of the propeller on the Apollo 11 mission- the first Apollo flight that would successfully land on the moon (7/20/1969).

Armstrong carried the pieces of the Wright Flyer along in his "personal preference kit" a bag of significant belongings that each astronaut was allowed to load onto the lunar module. Instead of just taking it to the moon, Armstrong took those artifacts out with him on his first moon walk!



Next Month's Program Preview






We Can't Forget The Flying Circus...

It's almost time for the Fall 2024 Fly-In/Drive-In Pancake Breakfast! While attendance is typically lower in the Fall than the Spring, let's see if we can set a Fall attendance record this year.

As you know, last Spring when we had our first, big record breaker (1,016), our Fall event really suffered due to the heavy rains from the tropical storm that were had that weekend. With only 448 attendees, we were definitely lucky to make enough to make ends meet.





The aircraft does not have an engine-driven electrical system, but has the safety and convenience of an electric starter and an aircraft battery to power the Sporty's PJ-2 portable radio (included) and your tablet or smartphone for navigation.

The permanently-installed external antenna connects to the PJ-2 to greatly extend its communications range.

Without an engine-driven electrical system, it is exempt from transponder and ADS-B requirements.

CELEBRATE LABOR DAY AS AN AIRCRAFT OWNER!

A Flying Car? It May Not Be Far Away...

We've seen flying cars in movies as early as 1906 (<u>The</u> "?" Motorist where a couple in their car is escaping from the police and go to outer space) to the latest in 2021 (<u>Fast & Furious 9</u> where Roman and Tej recruit Sean Boswell, Twinkie, and Earl, who have been working on a "rocket car" which they later use to enter orbit and destroy a satellite). Most remember the flying car in the James Bond movie, "The Man With The Golden Gun".

The flying car was the newly introduced AMC Matador Brougham Coupe, but the actual machine was not airworthy and could only make a 500-metre (1,640 ft) flight, so a meter-long (39 inch) remote controlled scale model built by John Stears was used for the film's aerial sequences. The stunt car was 9.15 m (30 ft) long, 12.80 m (42 ft) wide, and 3.08 m (10 ft) high.



Obviously, the movies are all fantasy, right? Well, maybe not. A company out of the European Union's greater Danube Valley region, AeroMobil, is designing and attempting to get air-worthiness clearance for their flying cars, and expect to begin delivery of these vehicles in early 2027.

Pegasus, inspired by the mythical winged horse Pegasus, the AeroMobil is a high-end vehicle that is to be at home on the road or in the sky. It is designed to seamlessly transform from car to aircraft – from driving to flying – in under three minutes.





There are two models planned- a two seater (pilot and passenger), and a 4-seater (pilot and 3 passengers). The interior is designed to be like a standard passenger vehicle with an LCD dashboard.



Their website has several different travel scenarios, one is from Redwood City, CA to South Lake Tahoe, NV, taking about two hours vs. 3 hours. Another route, from West Palm Beach, FL to Old Bahama Bay in Grand Bahama would be around an hour, compared to the 3 hours and 25 minutes via commercial air time.

While these estimates probably include the wait time for boarding and such, what they don't mention is the car rental savings at the destination. Many general aviation airports don't have rental cars there, so imagine flying from here to, let's say Boston, driving to Martha's Vineyard, see the sites, and then fly back all in the same vehicle.

The vehicle reportedly has undergone over 350,000 hours of engineering and design, with engineering and design assistance from automakers such as BMW, Aston

Martin, McLaren, Mercedes Benz F-I and Ferrari F-I, and aerospace leaders Lockheed Martin, Rolls Royce, Airbus, and Diamond Aircraft, among others. Note that this is not just on the drawing boards- they actually have prototypes and actual flight tests.



Live test flights of the AeroMobil began in September of 2020, almost 4 years ago. Initial reports are that it is easy to fly and highly stable. With the numerous GA airports in the US, it is easy to imagine flying from one


place to another and not having to rent a car to do siteseeing!

With the new FAA rules, (MOSAIC), it will be interesting to see where this craft is classified, most likely a LSA. It will also be interesting to see what type of insurance needs be carried on it (both aircraft and vehicle?), as well as any accident reporting- if involved in an auto accident, does it need to be reported to NTSB?
