Chapter 304 March Meeting Speaker


Mark Sekelsky from the National Weather Service/NOAA in Grand Rapids, MI will be addressing topics of interest such as:

Leon John Zimmerman 1920-2020

WWII Army Air Corp veteran who spoke at our Chapter last year



Zimmerman, Leon John 6/4/1924 - 2/20/2020 Leon John Zimmerman of Jackson, MI (known to many as Lee or Zim) went to be with the Lord and the love of his life Helen on Thursday, February 20, 2020. Lee was married to Helen, who passed away in 2017, for nearly 70 years. Their family includes a beloved daughter, Pamela, who passed away in 2000, and two sons, David and Thomas. Pamela was married to Kevin Harty and they provided a grandson, Christopher (Jennifer) Harty. David married Rhonda and provided two grandsons, Paul (Elizabeth) Zimmerman and Daniel (Brittany) Zimmerman. Thomas married Catherine and provided the first grandson Matthew (Dottie) Zimmerman and two granddaughters Rachael (Kyle) Spears, and A.J. (David) Wolf. The family now includes seven great grandchildren Lola, Riston Lee, Ruby, Levi, Cleo, Arden, and Clara Helen. In his own words "We have been blessed with good health and life is good. Thank you, God." Born on June 4, 1924, Lee was the son of Albert and Marie Zimmerman of Hersey, Michigan. Lee was attending Grand Rapids University when the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor. A true hero, he enlisted in the Army Air Corp rather than being drafted and having no choice of assignment. He served in the U.S. Army Mighty 8th Air Force in WWII as a B-17 Bombardier assigned to the 457th Bomb Group. His B-17 was shot down on his 22nd mission over Germany on November 30, 1944, resulting in Lee becoming a POW in Barth, Germany at the Stalag Luft #1. Lee's internment lasted until May of 1945. After returning he met and married Helen and became a loving and devoted husband, father, grandfather and great grandfather (Pops). A graduate from the University of Michigan, he led a successful career working as a manufacturers rep. for Balfour/Taylor. He was a respected community member involved in many organizations and groups including Kiwanis, the First United Methodist Church, and Jackson County Meal services, to name a few. Charismatic, big hearted, adventurous, tough but fair, lively, dedicated, sharp, my idol, confident, loyal, kind and very generous, are only a few of Zim's many attributes. Dedicated U of M sports fan, avid golfer, and world traveler, he made lifelong friends near and far; friendships treasured by many. Lee was a legend to all who knew him and will be dearly missed by many. A memorial service will be held at a later date to be announced.




March Meeting Speaker

EAA 304 Board meeting February 5th, 2020

Charlie Moore called the meeting to order at 5:35pm. In attendance were Charlie Moore, Chuck Furgason, Tracy Boyers, John Feldvary, Joan Feldvary and Greg Mears. George Race was absent

Old Business - Board reviewed notes from the January board meeting and implemented the following decisions:

By a unanimous vote effective January 1, 2020, all new members who join our chapter **must** become members of the National EAA. All current members will be "grandfathered" in and exempted from this requirement.

Per the Chapter By-Laws, those members who do not become EAA national members are prohibited from voting on anything that affects the chapter. One examples would be the ability to vote in our leadership elections

Board agreed unanimously that we would begin publishing the Board meeting minutes in the chapter newsletter

Board discussed the membership audit. Greg Mears mentioned that he has been working with the Secretary over at EAA 55 on a free tool that the National EAA uses. EAA 55 has found this tool to be quite useful. Since this option needs to be better researched. Discussion was tabled and the item will be added to next month's board meeting agenda

New business

President's report - Charlie is looking for volunteers for chapter ground maintenance, especially the flower beds. Volunteers please email Charlie

Treasurer's report – Chuck Furgason gave the treasurers report and in general the chapter is financially sound

Vice president's report – Tracy Boyers had nothing new to report this month **Secretary's report (Joan and Greg)**

EAA National is going to begin offering a "Free" website option to all the chapters later this year. We discussed the pros/cons of moving our website to the new national host versus staying with the current setup. The Board unanimously voted to have Greg and Joan maintain the current site at a cost of \$300 annually, and then transition to the free site being offered by the national once the National has the new sites set up and stable

Webpage-Facebook-Media report (Joan Feldvary)

Our Facebook page is doing quite well. Joan reviewed statistics for the page and Interestingly, 30% of the visitors to our page were women between the ages of 35-44. Board to investigate means to recruiting more female members for our chapter. Our YouTube channel is up and running and we welcome any videos members may have to be uploaded.
