### Bipartisan Infrastructure Law - Airport Infrastructure

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law provides \$15 billion in airport infrastructure funding. The money can be invested in runways, taxiways, safety and sustainability projects, as well as terminal,

airport-transit connections and roadway projects.

Second-Year Airport Infrastructure Grant Funding Amounts For FY23, another \$2.89 billion has been made

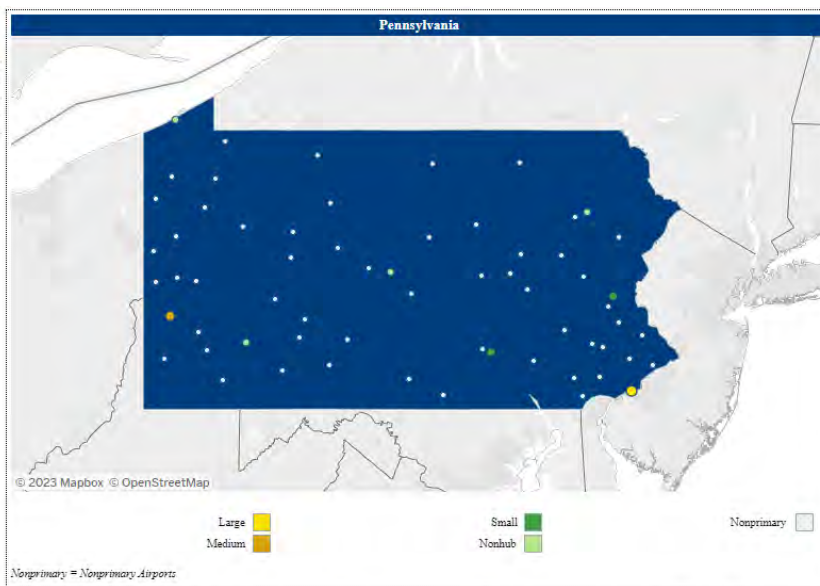
available to U.S. airports around the nation.

In FY22 and FY23, Pennsylvania received \$70 million each year. See more on this story on pages 12 and 13.

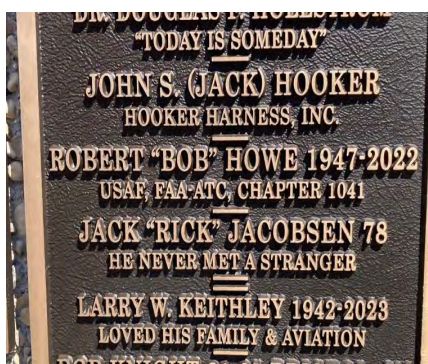

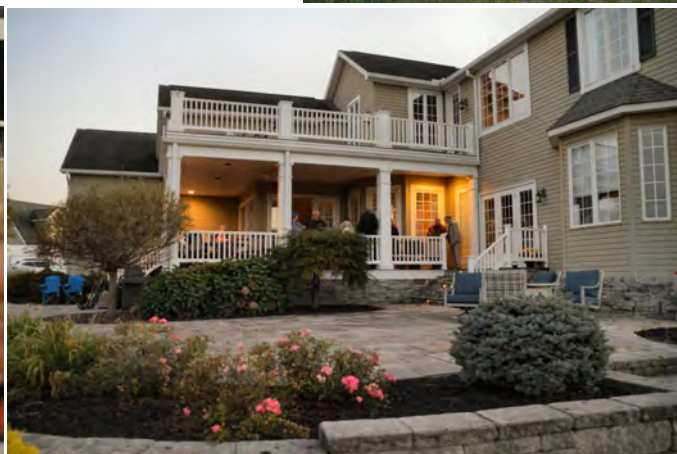
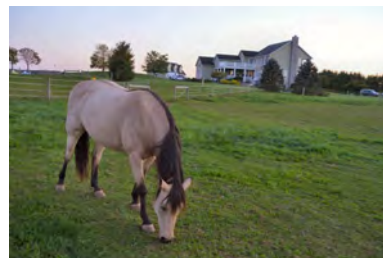

Book Review



**Devotion: An Epic Story of Heroism, Friendship, and Sacrifice by Adam Marks**  
Devotion tells the inspirational story of the U.S. Navy's most famous aviation duo, Lieutenant Tom Hudner and Ensign Jesse Brown, and the Marines they fought to defend. A white New Englander from the country-club scene, Tom passed up Harvard to fly fighters for his country. An African American sharecropper's son from Mississippi, Jesse became the navy's first Black carrier pilot, defending a notion that wouldn't even serve him in a bar. Deployed to the Mediterranean, Tom and Jesse meet the Fleet Marines, boys like PFC "Red" Parkinson, a farm kid from the Catskills. In between war games in the sun, the young men revel on the Riviera, partying with millionaires and even befriending the Hollywood starlet Elizabeth Taylor. Then comes the conflict that no one expected: the Korean War. Devotion takes us soaring overhead with Tom and Jesse, and into the foxholes with Red and the Marines as they battle a North Korean invasion. As the fury of the fighting escalates and the Marines are cornered at the Chosin Reservoir, Tom and Jesse fly, guns blazing, to try and save them. When one of the duo is shot down behind enemy lines and pinned in his burning plane, the other faces an unthinkable choice: watch his friend die or attempt history's most audacious one-man rescue mission. A tug-at-the-heartstrings tale of bravery and selflessness, Devotion asks: How far would you go to save a friend?

### The Doodle Bug

I spoke to John Egan at EAA today(10/24/2022), explained the donation of the Doodle Bug and asked if EAA might have an interest in having it for their collection. John did some research while we were on the phone, I sent him several photos of the pieces, and he relayed some very interesting information.

Lawrence Heuberger, the designer and original builder of this Doodle Bug, was EAA member # 5061. So he was an active member early on, and was also President of a Chapter in Texas. He flew the Doodle Bug to several EAA Conventions (fly-ins) in the 1950's and 1960's. John sent me archived pages from old EAA magazines after he searched for the builders name and the aircraft name. John said "this fellow certainly had to know Paul and vice-versa".

Anyway, EAA staff has an "aircraft donations" meeting on Thursday and John will present the photos I sent him. He does not know what the level interest may or may not be, but promised to communicate with us about it. So stay tuned, this could get even more interesting!

## Bipartisan Infrastructure Law - Airport Infrastructure

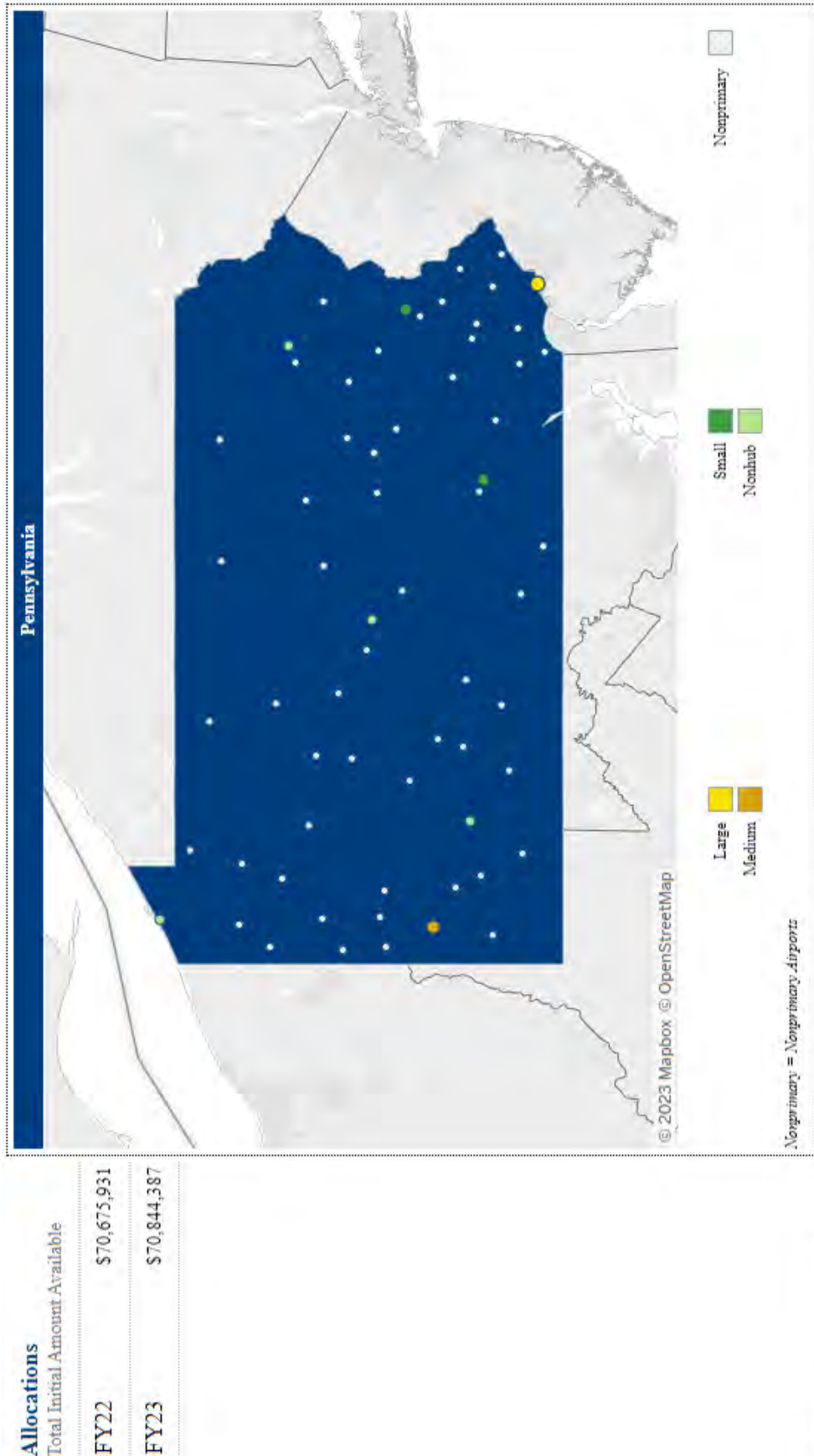
The map to the right shows the distribution of funds throughout the State of Pennsylvania.

As can be seen on the legend, most of the projects are categorized as “nonprimary”. Four are classified as “nonhub”, two “small”, one “medium” and one “large” (which appears to be Philadelphia).

The second graphic appearing on page 13 is the amount of funding that Gettysburg was granted in FY22 and FY23, roughly a quarter of a million for improvements.

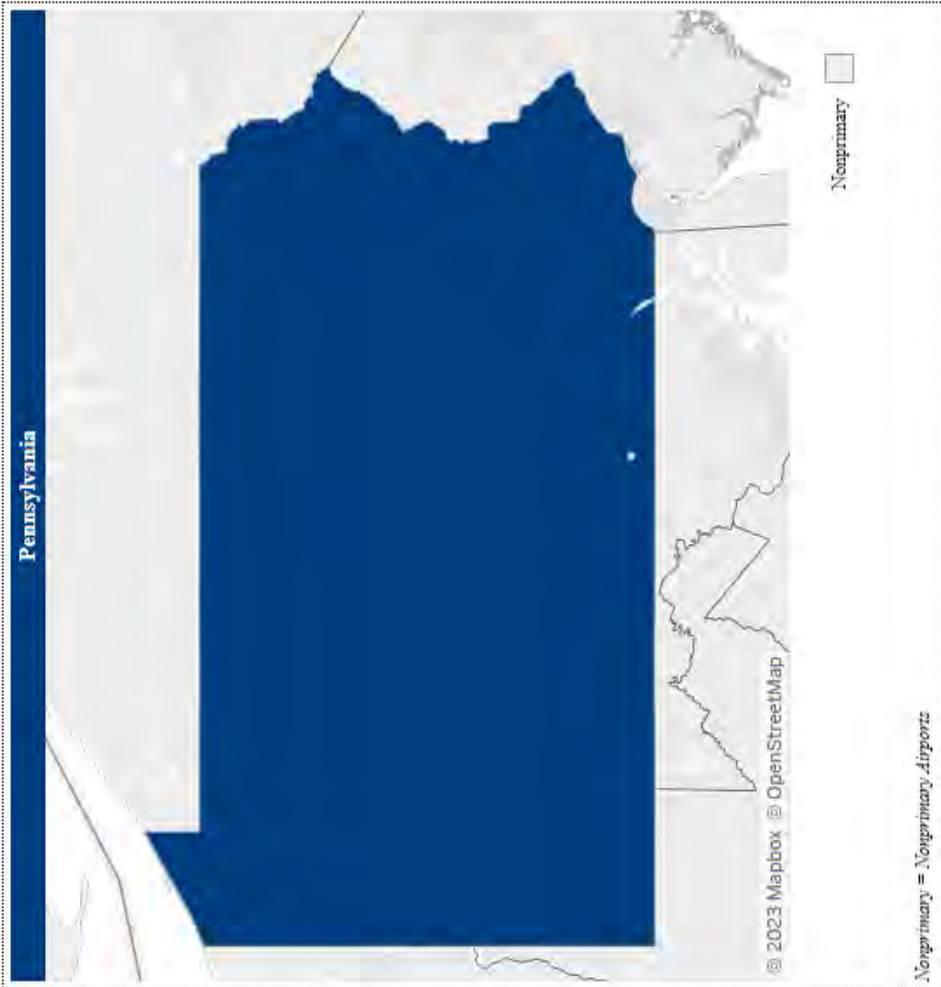
